NEW DEPLOYMENTS

TEXAS TORNADOES

April 3rd The National Weather Service has confirmed at least three tornadoes: one EF-3 in Tournery; an EF-2 tornado from Kennedale to Arlington, and one EF-2 in the City of Lancaster. Eight counties in northeast Texas reported storm impacts, including downed trees, damaged and destroyed homes and businesses, and road closures due to debris and flooding. 170 homes have been destroyed and 160 homes damaged. No fatalities have been reported. No Federal Declaration of Disaster has been made.

ARLINGTON, TX

Trinity Habitat for Humanity AmeriCorps

April 3rd

Seven members from Trinity Habitat for Humanity AmeriCorps began working immediate disaster response by securing Habitat for Humanity homes in Arlington, TX on Tuesday. This Habitat affiliate will continue to assess needs and may deploy further members to provide disaster response and recovery efforts.

ONGOING DEPLOYMENTS

INDIANA TORNADOES

March 2nd The National Weather Service received 16 reports of possible tornadoes on Friday, March 2. There were 13 confirmed fatalities in Clark County and five injuries. Media reported the near total destruction of the town of Maryville in Clark County. Several road closures have been reported due to debris. A Federal Disaster Declaration was made on March 9th.

JEFFERSONVILLE, IN

Interfaith Council RSVP

March 6th

The Interfaith Council RSVP in New Albany, IN has sent 20 RSVP members to set up and administer a Volunteer Reception Center in Jeffersonville, IN to assist Clark County, IN. This county includes the heavily damaged communities of Henryville, Marysville and Borden. These members have committed to this task for as long as is necessary.

AmeriCorps NCCC - North Central Region

March 22nd

NCCC North Central Region will be deploying Cedar 4, a team of 11 members to Jeffersonville, IN to support the United Way in operating the Volunteer Reception Center. Cedar 4 will be working to coordinate the volunteers working in Henryville and surrounding areas. Cedar 4 is expected to be deployed until April 27th.

KENTUCKY TORNADOES

March 2nd In addition to the tornadoes that struck several Kentucky counties on Wednesday, February 29th, severe storms impacted far western Kentucky and the southeastern corner of the State on March 2. A Federal Disaster Declaration was made on March 6th.

WEST LIBERTY AND MENIFEE COUNTY, KY

Morehead State University AmeriCorps Program

March 12th

The MSUCorps is collaborating with the Morehead State University Center for Regional Engagement to provide relief efforts in West Liberty. Members are working with All Hands, NECHAMA, the American Red Cross, AmeriCorps NCCC members, FEMA and the Index Community Center to provide volunteer leadership, home assessments and donations collection, management and distribution. Other members are serving in Menifee County, sorting and delivering food donations to storm survivors and leading volunteers in debris removal.

WEST LIBERTY, KY

Morehead State University AmeriCorps VISTA and Gateway Homeless Coalition AmeriCorps VISTA *March 8th*

Two AmeriCorps VISTAs have opened a Volunteer Reception Center in West Liberty. This VRC was opened at 12:00pm today. These members will be administering the VRC with additional assistance from AmeriCorps NCCC. This activity will end on April 17th.

AmeriCorps NCCC- Southern Region

March 8th

The NCCC Southern Region will be sending Delta 1, a team of twelve members to West Liberty, KY to assist Morehead State University with Volunteer Reception Center administration and volunteer leadership. Delta 1 will be working closely with the Morehead State University AmeriCorps VISTA project. The team's deployment has been extended from April 9th to April 18th.

MISSOURI TORNADOES

February 28th *A series of tornadoes struck the state of Missouri, including an EF-2 that hit Kimberling City and Branson. Damages were reported to over 167 homes. Three confirmed fatalities and over 50 injuries have been reported statewide.*

AmeriCorps St. Louis – 12 Members Deployed

February 29th

Stone and Taney Counties have requested AmeriCorps members through their State EMA. AmeriCorps St. Louis began staging Volunteer Reception Centers late Wednesday, splitting 12 members between each VRC. These members will be led by a veteran AmeriCorps member who was active during the Joplin Tornado response. These VRCs will focus on volunteer coordination and debris removal. AmeriCorps St. Louis will also be contributing assistance for tarping and sheltering. Two members have been placed to support the state's 211 call center. A team of five are also being utilized to fight a wildfire that was present but exacerbated by the severe weather.

WEST VIRGINIA SEVERE STORMS AND FLOODING

March 15th Severe weather has caused flooding, mudslides and landslides in West Virginia. On March 22nd a Presidential Declaration of Disaster was declared for Lincoln, Logan and Mingo counties.

LOGAN COUNTY, WV

AmeriCorps NCCC – Southern Region

April 1st

AmeriCorps NCCC has sent two teams, Delta 8 (12 members) and River 6 (10 members) to Logan County to assist the Logan County Emergency Management with local efforts to support survivor and community recovery, including: call center management, client intake and survey for long-term recovery, volunteer and donations management, mucking and gutting, and minor stream debris removal. Delta 8 and River 6 will be deployed until April 27th.

LOGAN COUNTY, WV

CNCS Disaster Cadre

April 1st

Bill Dillon, a seasoned Disaster Cadre member has been deployed to Logan County, WV to support the FEMA Region 3 and FEMA DR-4061-WV Individual Assistance VAL Unit in providing management of AmeriCorps Team deployments, including logistics, leading, training, coordinating with partners and reporting needed information to FEMA. Mr. Dillon will be deployed for two weeks.

STAND-BY

ARKANSAS TORNADO

March 19th An unconfirmed tornado was reported near the towns of Unionville and Cedarville in Crawford County, not major damage was reported. The State Emergency Operations Center reports that straight line winds caused property damage in Morrilton and Midway in Baxter County. At least 25 homes have been damaged. No injuries or deaths have been reported and the Arkansas EOC is not activated.

AmeriCorps NCCC and the State Service Commission are on stand-by to assist in the response effort.

LOUISIANA SEVERE WEATHER

March 20th *The National Weather Service confirmed 7 tornado touchdowns in Louisiana in Jefferson Davis, Vermilion, Ascension, St Mary and Caldwell Parishes and one possible touch down in St Tammany Parish. Additionally, flooding and threat of additional flooding are affecting the state. Flood watches and warnings remain in effect for numerous rivers. The Louisiana State Emergency Operations Center is activated.*

AmeriCorps NCCC and the State Service Commission are on stand-by to assist in the response effort.

MICHIGAN TORNADO AND SEVERE WEATHER

March 15th *Late Thursday afternoon, a tornado touched down northwest of Dexter, MI approximately 10 miles northwest of Ann Arbor, MI. The tornado travelled on a southeast path touching down sporadically for approximately 3.5 to 4 miles. Local news is reporting that over 100 homes have been affected. No Federal Declaration of Disaster has been made at this time.*

MISSISSIPPI HIGH WINDS

March 21st *Five counties in Mississippi have reported damages as a result of high winds. One storm related fatality was reported in Holmes county several homes have been damaged. The Mississippi State EOC is not activated at this time.*
