The state of **Hawaii** is supported by the AmeriCorps NCCC Pacific Region campus. Located in Sacramento at the former McClellan Air Force Base, the Pacific Region campus houses approximately **300** members and team leaders each year and serves the states of Alaska, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming and the Pacific U.S. Territories

AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) is a full-time, team-based residential program for men and women ages 18-24. NCCC members, assigned to one of five regional campuses, are organized into teams of approximately ten members and serve in local communities in every state responding to needs that are identified by community-based organizations. Approximately 1200 members serve in NCCC each year.

Teams serve with local and national organizations, providing an infusion of resources and leading volunteers for Habitat for Humanity, the American Red Cross, and hundreds of other organizations. These dedicated and energetic young adults lead youth development activities, construct and rehabilitate low-income housing, clean up streams, help communities develop emergency plans, and address other pressing local needs. A flexible program structure allows for partnership with organizations that might lack the capacity to manage grant programs and for strategic collaboration with other national service programs to magnify the impact on the communities served.

As the federal government's direct national service wing, NCCC's structure allows for rapid deployment of teams in emergencies. Trained in CPR, first aid, disaster response and firefighting, NCCC teams have responded to local and national disasters since the program was established in 1994. **Since 2000, NCCC members have served more than 4.7 million hours on over 1,760 disaster services projects across the nation.**

*NCCC teams have removed 63 tons of invasive species from Kanaha Beach Park, an 88 acre shoreline park, as part of a native Hawaiian plant restoration effort. The teams on Maui also uncovered an archeological site of great importance in Honokowai Valley and contributed towards the restoration efforts of the Old Maui High School by clearing invasive species and removing over 22 tons of recyclable materials. The work of NCCC for and with the community has been a tremendous boost to Community Work Day Program's projects for the communities on Maui, Molokai, and Lana'i. Maui County is better for their ongoing service and the team's demonstrated work ethic and spirit.*
