**Joplin, MO Tornado**

**NEW Situation Update (as of 5/25/2011)**

Nearly 100 AmeriCorps members have been deployed in response to the deadly tornado that struck Joplin, Missouri on May 22. They are conducting a range of activities including operating the missing person hotline, establishing the volunteer reception center, managing a donations warehouse, coordinating volunteers, and clearing debris.

Within 2 hours after the tornado struck Joplin, AmeriCorps members from St. Louis AmeriCorps Emergency Response Team packed their equipment and drove through the night to Joplin. Arriving at 2:00 am, they immediately set up a Missing Persons hotline housed at Missouri Southern State University that went live at 5:30 am Monday morning. This 24-hour hotline, organized and staffed by AmeriCorps members and volunteers, has fielded and logged more than 3,000 calls from people trying to locate and confirm the safety of friends or family. The database is shared with the Sheriffs office, State Highway Patrol, and others involved in search and rescue operations.

The AmeriCorps members include 25 members from the AmeriCorps St. Louis Emergency Response Team, 43 AmeriCorps NCCC members from the Denver campus; 12 Washington Conservation Corps members, and 10 members of the Hoopa Tribal Civilian Community Corps from California. These members were able to deploy very quickly because most had been in St. Louis responding to the Good Friday tornado.

- Bill Dillon- Bill formerly served as Missouri State Director and now serves in that capacity for Washington/Alaska.
- Patti Stengel- Patti works out of the KS/MO state Office. She took leave to go to Joplin and help her family and community after it was impacted by the tornado that destroyed over 8,000 structures. She contacted the DSU to offer assistance and was working with FEMA the very next day supporting voluntary agency coordination in Joplin.
- Will Chrysanthos- Will is an Eli Segal Fellow who also served out of the Mississippi Commission including taking on a stint with the U.S. Coast Guard Unified Command in Mobile Alabama during the Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill.

**Flooding and Tornadoes-April 22, 2011**

**Situation Update (As of Friday, May 6, 2011)**

- AmeriCorps St. Louis is fully mobilized and providing support to meet challenges arising from both disaster events that have far exceeded local capacities
- An operational base has been established at the United Way of Greater St. Louis, to provide support for multi-agency coordination and collaboration, and to enable the use of 211 to intake needs from the disaster affected public and referral to helping resources.
- Base camp established in the Village of Riverview at the Lutheran Community Center to house and support responding out-of-state helping resources.
  - Two 11-person teams of NCCC Southwest Two 6-person teams from the State of Washington Conservation Corps.

- Multiple Members from Grace Hill and the Riverways Project have also assisted in North St. Louis County
- Members from Poplar Bluff's Promise AmeriCorps program have provided direct assistance: assisting with sheltering displaced residents, in-taking and organizing requests for assistance, operating a local supply point of distribution, and supporting a multi-agency resource center to supply helpful information to the public.
- All of the above resources are being coordinated with several volunteer and faith-based groups including All Hands Volunteers, Missouri United Methodist Disaster Relief Team, Lutheran Disaster Response, NECHAMA Jewish Disaster Response and the Salvation Army. Many corporations have supplied organized groups of volunteers to assist.

**Situation Update (as of 5/19/2011) from the Alabama Governor's Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives**

The Alabama Commission has been activated at Level 1 at the State Emergency Operations Center has been since April 27, 2011. On Monday May 9, 2011 operations began to transition to the Joint Field Office in Birmingham. Additionally the Commission is:

- Alabama Commission staff is embedded at the FEMA Joint Field Office and coordinating efforts with their FEMA Volunteer Agency Liaison (VAL).
- Coordinating VRC (VRCs listed at [www.ServeAlabama.gov](http://www.ServeAlabama.gov)) coverage for the State in partnership with the Alabama VOAD.
- Providing coverage to t27 Disaster Recovery Centers
- Participating on the joint state/federal housing task force as housing Volunteer Florida staff are supporting the Joint Field Office (Birmingham) working with GFBCI staff on VRC support and transition planning to Long Term Recovery.
- Volunteer Florida and Serve Louisiana have provided consultation and materials to support the AL Commission inventory in some affected areas is almost non-existent.

- The Volunteer and Information Center VISTA project deployed 4 staff and 1 AmeriCorps VISTA member to set up and coordinate a VRC for the Cullman County area. 2,341 volunteers have been registered, safety trained and dispatched into the affected area.
- VIC staff and the VISTA member trained the United Way staff in Cullman and volunteers to run and manage the VRC after the project left on Sunday evening. The sponsor worked closely with the Cullman County EMA director and Cullman City officials to identify needs and coordinate volunteer service of the thousands of (SUV's) Spontaneous Unaffiliated Volunteers who arrived wanting to help.
- A total of 13,944 volunteer hours were provided in Cullman County from noon April 29<sup>th</sup> until 6pm on Sunday.

VOAD/RSVP volunteers were activated by Emergency Management Agency on 4/28/2011. 25 volunteers operated the Volunteer Reception Center serving a total of 140 hours and 1100 spontaneous volunteers were deployed in Limestone County.

On the university's day of service ("Buenafication" Day,) AmeriCorps members served as site leaders and led over 100 of their peers in tornado clean up. Projects are continuing and they send groups out sometimes daily. Their AmeriCorps members have been instrumental in direct service with the efforts, but also the behind the scenes work with coordinating service sites, follow ups, and mapping out projects.

Jackson, MS**

The Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Service (MCVS) launched a Flood Recovery Volunteer Registration program on May 12<sup>th</sup>, and over 800 individuals have registered. Individuals and volunteer groups interested in serving affected areas after flood waters recede may register online at [www.mcvs.org](http://www.mcvs.org) or call 888.353.1793 to register by phone. MCVS continues to work with local Emergency Managers in federally declared disaster counties to determine and address

needs related to volunteers and donations management. In the weeks to come, pre-registered volunteers will receive notification of opportunities to serve Mississippi communities in need.

MCVS Deputy Director of Programs and Operations Brandi McNeil said, "Volunteer registration allows MCVS to maximize volunteers' impact by matching a group or individual's skills and availability to a community's immediate needs. MCVS works with state and local Emergency Managers to ensure that volunteers can safely and effectively serve those with the greatest needs in times of disaster."

To date, MCVS has documented over **7,600** tornado relief volunteers serving over **33,300** hours since Friday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, with Volunteer Reception Centers (VRCs) still active in four tornado-affected counties. VRCs, in coordination with MCVS and local Emergency Managers, are now scheduling volunteer groups for structured disaster recovery activities. All volunteers should call ahead to local VRCs to schedule volunteer work.

May 15-16, 2011**

Twenty NCCC AmeriCorps members worked in the Vicksburg area around their campus providing flood-related work. **For those working in flooded areas**

**MRSA** (Methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* (MRSA), is a bacterial infection that is highly resistant to some antibiotics. The bacteria can cause infection when they enter the body through a cut, sore, catheter, or breathing tube. The infection can be minor and local (for example, a pimple), or more serious (involving the heart, lung, blood, or bone). So, if you are working with the flood waters, victims, or doing damage assessment, be very careful, wear gloves, wash your hands regularly, and try to NOT touch anything unless absolutely necessary.

Secretary of Homeland Security Janet Napolitano announced the release of FY 2011 grant guidance and application kits for 12 DHS grant programs totaling \$2.1 billion to assist states, urban areas, tribal and territorial governments, non-profit agencies, and the private sector in strengthening our nation's ability to prevent, protect, respond to and recover from terrorist attacks, major disasters and other emergencies.

We would like to thank the last Southern Region NCCC members and highlight a few of their accomplishments.

**Total Number of Projects:** 89 projects (106 assignments to 66 organizations)

**Total Hours Served:** 190,000

**April Tornadoes Disaster Response Projects:** These figures are the total quantifiables for all disaster projects related to the April Tornadoes. They include the response to the early April tornadoes in Leakesville and Clinton and the North Carolina Tornadoes. They also include all the response to the April 25<sup>th</sup> tornadoes and our projects in MS, AL, and TN

- People assisted in disaster areas: 26,459 people
- Tons of food collected or distributed: 118.5 tons
- Tons of clothing collected or distributed: 42.4 tons
- Disaster Service Facilities supported: 15 facilities
- People assisted at mass care facilities: 17,080 people
- Meals served in disaster areas: 13,408 meals
- Damage or needs assessments completed: 1,357 assessments
- Tons of debris or trash removed: 392.7 tons
- Volunteers recruited or coordinated: 845 volunteers
