NEW DEPLOYMENTS

INDIANA TORNADOES

March 2nd The National Weather Service received 16 reports of possible tornadoes on Friday, March 2. There were 13 confirmed fatalities in Clark County and five injuries. Media reported the near total destruction of the town of Maryville in Clark County. Several road closures have been reported due to debris.

JEFFERSONVILLE, IN

AmeriCorps NCCC - North Central Region

March 22nd NCCC North Central Region will be deploying Cedar 4, a team of 11 members to Clarksville, IN to support the United Way in operating the Volunteer Reception Center. Cedar 4 will be working to coordinate the volunteers working in Henryville and surrounding areas. Cedar 4 is expected to be deployed until April 27th.

INDIANA TORNADOES

JEFFERSONVILLE, IN

Interfaith Council RSVP

March 6th

The Interfaith Council RSVP in New Albany, IN has sent ten RSVP members to set up and administer a Volunteer Reception Center in Jeffersonville, IN to assist Clark County, IN. This county includes the heavily damaged communities of Henryville, Marysville and Borden. These members have committed to this task for as long as is necessary.

KENTUCKY TORNADES

March 2nd In addition to the tornadoes that struck several Kentucky counties on Wednesday, February 29th, severe storms impacted far western Kentucky and the southeastern corner of the State on March 2. A Federal Disaster Declaration was made on March 6th.

LIBERTY, KY

CNCS Staff Visits Affected Community

March 16th

Darryl James, Southern Cluster Manager for CNCS visited Liberty, KY this week to see first hand the AmeriCorps and Senior Corps members working the tornado response and recovery efforts. During his visit, Betsy Wells, CNCS State Program Director organized a cross section of sponsors, project supervisors and AmeriCorps members. These members included representation from AmeriCorps VISTA, AmeriCorps State/National and AmeriCorps NCCC. All of these entities, including the private sector are working together to recover from the disaster that affected their community.

While there, Darryl visited the community soup kitchen. A woman named Lulu manages the kitchen when not working as a nurse. The soup kitchen generally serves 100 meals per day but since March 3rd, the day after the Tornado, they have served 15,000 meals to the homeless, volunteers, or anyone who walked through their the door that needed a hot meal. The community soup kitchen is supported by a RSVP volunteer who happens to be the mother of an AmeriCorps Project Director.

At a lunch meeting with approximately 13 national service sponsors and representatives of local organizations, Darryl learned about their activities that showed a great example of how public and private entities can work well together in a crisis.

Darryl also had an opportunity to meet with VISTA, AmeriCorps and NCCC members at a local Volunteer Reception Center where the members are fielding calls of people from all over the country who want to donate items and volunteer to help in the clean up. These members are also taking calls from residents affected by the storm in need of skilled labor to remove a tree from their yard, fix a damaged roof, or in need of other help. The members, he reported, are doing a good job matching citizens' needs with volunteers' skill.

Finally, he was taken on a guided tour of the tornado damage in the town West Liberty, KY. "I can't find the words to convey the level of destruction the city experienced. Nonetheless they're in the cleanup phase currently, and looking ahead to rebuilding everything loss in the storm".

WEST LIBERTY AND MENIFEE COUNTY, KY

Morehead State University AmeriCorps Program

March 12th

The MSUCorps is collaborating with the Morehead State University Center for Regional Engagement to provide relief efforts in West Liberty. Members are working with All Hands, NECHAMA, the American Red Cross, AmeriCorps NCCC members, FEMA and the Index Community Center to provide volunteer leadership, home assessments and donations collection, management and distribution. Other members are serving in Menifee County, sorting and delivering food donations to storm survivors and leading volunteers in debris removal.

FRANKFORT, KY

AmeriCorps VISTA

March 12th

Up to seven AmeriCorps VISTA members from KY Domestic Violence Association in Frankfort, Next Step in Louisville, Carnegie Center for Literacy in Lexington and KY Campus Compact are serving various shifts at the Kentucky Emergency Management center since Friday March 9th. They along with volunteers, AmeriCorps State & National Program Directors and staff from the Kentucky State Service Commission will assist in coordinating donations of materials, manpower and other services that had been sent to the EMS or EOC website in the week following the tornadoes. These members received training from NVOAD on the National Disaster Management Network Matrix.

WEST LIBERTY, KY

Morehead State University AmeriCorps VISTA and Gateway Homeless Coalition AmeriCorps VISTA

March 8th

Three AmeriCorps VISTAs have opened a Volunteer Reception Center in West Liberty. This VRC was opened at 12:00pm today. These members will be administering the VRC with additional assistance from AmeriCorps NCCC.

AmeriCorps NCCC- Southern Region

March 8th

The NCCC Southern Region will be sending Delta 1, a team of twelve members to West Liberty, KY to assist Morehead State University with Volunteer Reception Center administration and volunteer leadership. Delta 1 will be working closely with the Morehead State University AmeriCorps VISTA project. The team will redeploy to the Southern Region Campus on April 9th.

MISSOURI TORNADOES

February 28th *A series of tornadoes struck the state of Missouri, including an EF-2 that hit Kimberling City and Branson. Damages were reported to over 167 homes. Three confirmed fatalities and over 50 injuries have been reported statewide.*

On March 4th and 5th, Idara Nickelson, Chief Programs Officer and Kelly DeGraff, Director of Disaster Services of CNCS visited tornado impacted communities and met with key leaders in the recovery effort in Joplin.

STONE AND TANEY COUNTIES, MO

AmeriCorps NCCC- Southwestern Region

March 2nd

AmeriCorps NCCC has sent Sun 3, a team of ten members to assist AmeriCorps St. Louis in Branson, MO in the tornado disaster response and assist with the current Red Flag Warning in Lebanon, MO. Seven members are helping AmeriCorps St. Louis in administering the Volunteer Reception Center and assisting and supervising volunteers. Three members are assisting with wildfire operations. Sun 3 will redeploy to the Southwestern Campus on March 16th.

AmeriCorps St. Louis – 12 Members Deployed

February 29th

Stone and Taney Counties have requested AmeriCorps members through their State EMA. AmeriCorps St. Louis began staging Volunteer Reception Centers late Wednesday, splitting 12 members between each VRC. These members will be led by a veteran AmeriCorps member who was active during the Joplin Tornado response. These VRCs will focus on volunteer coordination and debris removal. AmeriCorps St. Louis will also be contributing assistance for tarping and sheltering. Two members have been placed to support the state's 211 call center. A team of five are also being utilized to fight a wildfire that was present but exacerbated by the severe weather. March 2nd *The National Weather Service received nine reports of possible tornadoes on Friday, March 2nd. There are two confirmed fatalities and eight injuries.*

Four members from the American Red Cross AmeriCorps program are in Cincinnati are assisting the American Red Cross with client casework intake and assisting in standing up shelters.

TENNESSEE SEVERE WEATHER

February 29th Additional storms affected Tennessee on Friday, March 2nd. The National Weather Service received reports of eleven possible tornadoes. Damage was reported for over fifty homes. Forty injuries were reported in five counties; Hamilton, Bradley, Polk, Monroe and McMinn. The state's Emergency Management Agency has been active since February 29th. A Federal Disaster Declaration was made for Tennessee on March 16th.

OOLTEWAH, TN

AmeriCorps NCCC - Southern Region

March 16th NCCC Southern Region is deploying River 2 a team eight members Ooltewah, TN (just outside Chattanooga in Hamilton County), in response to the March 2 tornado. The team will be requested by United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) Holston Annual Conference Early Response Team, and will assist UMCOR with debris removal throughout the affected area. River 2 will be deployed until April 1st.

STAND-BY

ARKANSAS TORNADO

March 19th An unconfirmed tornado was reported near the towns of Unionville and Cedarville in Crawford County, not major damage was reported. The State Emergency Operations Center reports that straight line winds caused property damage in Morrilton and Midway in Baxter County. At least 25 homes have been damaged. No injuries or deaths have been reported and the Arkansas EOC is not activated.

March 20th *The National Weather Service confirmed 7 tornado touchdowns in Louisiana in Jefferson Davis, Vermilion, Ascension, St Mary and Caldwell Parishes and one possible touch down in St Tammany Parish. Additionally, flooding and threat of additional flooding are affecting the state. Flood watches and warnings remain in effect for numerous rivers. The Louisiana State Emergency Operations Center is activated.*

MICHIGAN TORNADO AND SEVERE WEATHER

March 15th *Late Thursday afternoon, a tornado touched down northwest of Dexter, MI approximately 10 miles northwest of Ann Arbor, MI. The tornado travelled on a southeast path touching down sporadically for approximately 3.5 to 4 miles. Local news is reporting that over 100 homes have been affected. No Federal Declaration of Disaster has been made at this time.*

MISSISSIPPI HIGH WINDS

March 21st *Five counties in Mississippi have reported damages as a result of high winds. One storm related fatality was reported in Holmes county several homes have been damaged. The Mississippi State EOC is not activated at this time.*

TEXAS TORNADOES
