



Performance Highlights¹ for Florida

2003-2004

EDUCATION

(11 subgrantees reporting)
 2,912 students in grades K-12 received tutoring.
 800 students benefited from school and community-based after-school programs.

ENVIRONMENT

(1 subgrantee reporting)
 85 miles of trail were cleared, 56 acres of land were planted with trees, and 7,326 acres of habitat were restored or conserved.
 54 environmental education and interpretive activities were provided for 6,622 local residents.

HUMAN NEEDS

(6 subgrantees reporting)
 576 frail seniors received respite or home maintenance services.
 79 cars were repaired and given to Welfare to Work recipients.
 105 persons with disabilities successfully reintegrated back into their communities.

PUBLIC SAFETY

(1 subgrantee reporting)
 300 students at risk of criminal involvement or school failure were mentored.
 1,084 hours of support were provided to police, responding to non-emergency public safety calls.

COMMUNITY STRENGTHENING

(20 subgrantees reporting)
 More than 600 community service projects were conducted and staffed by members.

VOLUNTEER LEVERAGING

(20 subgrantees reporting)
 4,437 volunteers were recruited for wide-ranging service day projects and community projects.

MEMBER DEVELOPMENT

(20 subgrantees reporting)
 396 members were trained in CPR, diversity, conflict resolution, and inclusion.

2004-2005

EDUCATION

(8 subgrantees reporting)
 4,751 students received tutoring in reading and literacy.

ENVIRONMENT

(1 subgrantee reporting)
 338 miles of trail were cleared and 25,967 acres of public lands or habitat were restored or conserved.
 1,382 students benefited from environmental education programs provided by members.

HUMAN NEEDS

(13 subgrantees reporting)
 380 families or caregivers caring for frail seniors received respite or home maintenance services.
 68 cars were repaired and given to Welfare to Work recipients.
 232 housing units for low-income families or seniors were constructed or repaired.
 150 individuals with disabilities were provided employment support.

PUBLIC SAFETY

(1 subgrantee reporting)
 150 community residents were trained in homeland security safety measures.
 Members completed 460 community safety patrols, providing 1,787 hours of assistance to police.

COMMUNITY STRENGTHENING

(22 subgrantees reporting)
 1,000 individuals were educated on aging sensitivity.
 374 students were trained as peer tutors for 202 students.

VOLUNTEER LEVERAGING

(22 subgrantees reporting)
 7,593 volunteers were recruited to serve the educational and human needs of community residents.

MEMBER DEVELOPMENT

(14 subgrantees reporting)
 71 members were trained in citizenship and civic responsibility.
 304 members received training and support in preparation for their post-AmeriCorps job search.

Data Source: All data are aggregates of the data subgrantees report in the AmeriCorps Progress Reports. State Commissions review subgrantees' reports, and then submit approved information to AmeriCorps through the Grantee Progress Reports (GPR). AmeriCorps programs vary in their start and end dates, and not all programs operate during the same timeframe. During any given year the time period of activity reported is between October 1st through September 30th. Any program activity that may have occurred after September 30, 2005 is not captured in this report.

1 For Florida, all 2003-2004 performance highlights are based on Formula and Competitive Award subgrantee self-report (total number of subgrantees for Florida in 2003-2004 was 20). For 2004-2005, all performance highlights are based on Formula and Competitive Award subgrantee self-report (total number of subgrantees for Florida in 2004-2005 was 24).







AmeriCorps State Members Serving in Florida Counties: 2004-05





¹ For education award usage rates, we examined awards in which members have had three or more years to access the award. This decision was based on evidence that most members use the education award within three years of earning it.

For this report, we have identified members who served in 1994-1995 through 2001-2002 to examine usage rates for education awards.

1994-1995 through 1997-1998: Members who served in 1994-1995 through 1997-1998 have completed their seven-year education award eligibility period; because the eligibility period for using the education award is completed, we have aggregated the usage rate for these members.

1998-1999 through 2001-2002: Members who served in 1998-1999 through 2001-2002 have at least one year of eligibility left. As former members of these years access their education awards, these data will fluctuate as the awards remain active.

We will continue to track AmeriCorps member education award usage by year, adding an additional year in the “eligibility remaining” portion of the graph. Usage rates may differ from year to year as more earned education award money is withdrawn from members’ Trust accounts. As members end their seven-year period of eligibility they will be added to the “eligibility completed” group.
