

**Alaska FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet**

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Alaska. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to Serve Alaska, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Alaska are projected to earn \$115,500 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

### Program Summary

The Rural Alaska Community Action Program, Inc. (RurAL CAP) proposes to have 20 AmeriCorps members who will organize a variety of community-driven, evidence-informed interventions that engage primarily Alaska Native youth and build resiliency to prevent substance abuse and suicide in 15 remote, rural and severely under-resourced tribal communities across Alaska and 5 in urban hub communities. At the end of the second program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for increasing resiliency factors of cultural identity or supportive relationships in 208 youth. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 1,000 volunteers who will be engaged in youth-driven service initiatives and activities.
