

California FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to California. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to California Volunteers, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in California that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in California are projected to earn \$13,060,509 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

The Interval House AmeriCorps National Direct Program, a two-state comprehensive domestic violence and violence prevention program specializing in cultural and economic empowerment, will have 24 AmeriCorps members who will build upon Interval House's very successful 16-year history of transformative AmeriCorps programming by providing cutting edge, multilingual financial literacy and job skills development in some of the most economically devastated pockets of poverty throughout financially depressed communities in Southern California and on the island of Molokai, Hawaii.
