

Colorado FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Colorado. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to Serve Colorado, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in Colorado that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Colorado are projected to earn \$4,254,106 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

Program Summary

The Colorado Parent and Child Foundation (CPCF) proposes to have 49 AmeriCorps members who will deliver the Home Instruction for Parents of Preschool Youngsters (HIPPY) evidence-based, school readiness program to families with children ages 3, 4, and 5 in Adams, Alamosa, Costilla, Crowley, Denver, Jefferson, Pueblo, Saguache, and Weld counties. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for the engagement of 725 children and their parents in the children's pre-school education and development through the HIPPY program. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 80 volunteers who will be engaged in episodic and ongoing activities supporting the HIPPY program.

Conservation Legacy and the Student Conservation Association (SCA) propose to have 89 AmeriCorps members who will complete forest fire mitigation and restoration through fire fuels reduction, pile burning, prescribed burns and fireline construction at ten sites in Arizona, Colorado, Florida, South Dakota, Washington and Wyoming. Mile High United Way proposes to have 54 AmeriCorps members, 54 full-time slots, who will focus their efforts to improve literacy proficiency of kindergarten through third grade students in the highest-need schools in a four-county area of Metro Denver, CO consisting of Adams, Arapahoe, Denver, and Jefferson County. At the end of the first program year, AmeriCorps members will be responsible for increasing the reading proficiency of over 1200 students in Metro Denver, CO. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 900 volunteers, who will be engaged in providing literacy mentoring sessions to over 700 third grade students throughout Metro Denver, CO.
