




# FEMA Corps Clearance Process

At any stage in the process, member may be contacted if additional information is required.



\* To complete the eQIP, you must provide information regarding where you have lived, worked and attended school in the past seven years. You must also provide information about your criminal history, illegal drug use and delinquencies on loans or other financial obligations. FEMA clears the vast majority of FEMA Corps Members for access to its systems and facilities. If FEMA revokes or denies a member's access to its systems and facilities, the member's service with FEMA Corps is terminated. Dishonesty and issues that cannot be resolved to FEMA's satisfaction regarding criminal history, illegal drug use, and financial delinquencies, are the most common reasons for refusing or revoking members' access to its systems and facilities.
