

### Georgia FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Georgia. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to the Georgia Commission on Service and Volunteerism, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in Georgia that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Georgia are projected to earn \$3,205,125 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

### Program Summary

Habitat for Humanity International proposes to have 350 AmeriCorps members who will engage volunteers to build new homes, repair existing homes, and revitalize neighborhoods, with 95 affiliates in 25 states in the U.S. At the end of the first program year, AmeriCorps members will be responsible for providing 4,800 economically disadvantaged individuals with housing services, 2,100 of whom will transition into safe, healthy, and affordable housing. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 102,000 of volunteers who will be engaged in providing housing services for these 4,800 individuals.

This program will focus on the CNCS focus area of Economic Opportunity. The CNCS investment of \$4,655,000 will be matched by \$5 million in program fees from participating Habitat affiliates and in-kind from Habitat International headquarters.

### Program Summary

Points of Light proposes to have 50 AmeriCorps members who will conduct disaster preparedness education for vulnerable communities and populations, engage community stakeholders in community resilience disaster exercises, and recruit and train 500 volunteer leaders in disaster volunteer management in Iowa, Nebraska, Michigan, Missouri, Indiana, Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey, Texas, Florida, Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina, California and Washington. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for increasing individual and family preparedness for 150,000 beneficiaries, and 10,000 individuals and organizations preparing through participation in community disaster drills. The AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 500 volunteers who will be engaged in activities to build community resilience and continue to support the community resilience strategy after the program year concludes.

### Program Summary

Points of Light proposes to have 50 AmeriCorps members who will engage service members, veterans, and their families in volunteer leader training in California, Georgia, Virginia, New York, Texas, North Carolina, Florida, Illinois, and Washington, DC. We requested 50 AmeriCorps members for our 2015 program year. We will allocate 10 slots (2 FT and 16 PT), which is 20% of our total slots, to members with disabilities. By the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for training 1,200 service members, veterans, and their families as volunteer leaders to increase the knowledge of volunteer leadership principles, increase community perceptions of the military and create stronger bonds between the civilian community and military and veteran families. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 7,500 volunteers who will be engaged in volunteer service projects that will address a community need. This program will focus on the CNCS focus area of Veterans.

### Program Summary

Teach For America - Metro Atlanta (TFA-ATL) will have 125 AmeriCorps Members (ACMs) who will teach for two years in more than 50 Title I, SIG, and priority public and charter schools throughout Atlanta, Fulton, and Clayton County Public Schools. At the end of the 1st program year (2016-17 school year), the ACMs will increase the academic outcomes for 7,750 students throughout Metro Atlanta. This experience, coupled with ongoing professional and leadership development during their two year commitment, will catalyze ACMs' lifelong commitment to ensuring educational equity for all students. The ACMs will leverage an additional 250 volunteers who will be engaged in supporting students within Metro Atlanta classrooms.
