ABOUT THE AWARD: GENERAL COMMUNITY SERVICE

- The General Community Service category recognizes institutions that have made a commitment to improving the quality of life of off-campus community residents, particularly low-income individuals.
- Schools are engaged in service that address:
 - Education;
 - Health;
 - Economic opportunity;
 - Environmental restoration, and/or
 - Support for veterans and military families.

ABOUT THE AWARD: ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

- The Economic Opportunity category recognizes institutions with service programs that build economic independence, increase family stability, and create more sustainable and resilient communities.
- Schools are engaged in service that improves the financial well-being and security of economically disadvantaged individuals.

ABOUT THE AWARD: EDUCATION

- The Education category recognizes institutions that have made a commitment to improving educational outcomes for children and youth in pre-kindergarten through undergraduate education.
- Institutions are engaged in service that:
 - Strengthens schools;
 - Addresses school readiness;
 - Addresses early warning indicators such as attendance and behavior issues;
 - Boosts high school graduation rates, and/or
 - Helps to prepare youth for college success.

ABOUT THE AWARD: INTERFAITH COMMUNITY SERVICE

- Interfaith Community Service programs foster meaningful relationships among community members of differing faiths and backgrounds.
- Schools are engaged in service that demonstrate:
 - Participation of campus and community faith-based organizations, and
 - Cooperation of faculty, staff, and students of diverse faiths and secular perspectives in projects that tackle community challenges.
