

## Indiana FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Indiana. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to Serve Indiana, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Indiana are projected to earn \$2,264,530 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

### Program Summary

The American Red Cross (ARC) of Indiana will have 25 AmeriCorps members ("Indiana Response and Preparedness (RAP) Corps") who will provide disaster services and capacity building services to improve disaster cycle services - disaster preparedness, response, and recovery. At the end of the 1st program year, the RAP Corps will be responsible for: (1) recruiting and placing 400 new disaster volunteers in specific roles; (2) matching existing disaster volunteers' skills with optimal volunteer roles; (3) assisting with volunteer disaster preparedness training of 500 adults and 2500 youth; (4) facilitating 700 encounters with Hoosiers involved in disasters; and (5) building and strengthening relationships with more than 200 community partners to increase resources to meet the needs of individuals and families impacted by disaster.

### Program Summary

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Wayne County will support 185 AmeriCorps members who will work with Indiana children through education, healthy lifestyles, and character & leadership development in Boys & Girls Clubs facilities across Indiana. At the end of the 1st program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for (1) serving 30,000 children in education programs with 85% completing a 30 session program and 75% of those increasing their reading/math fluency scores by at least 15%; (2) provide over 225,000 nutritious snacks/meals, engage 35,000 in after school physical activity, and 6,000 in nutrition education programs; and (3) complete 800 community service projects, recruit 2,600 volunteers with over 26,000 hours of volunteer service.

### Program Summary

The Robinson Community Learning Center (RCLC) will have 29 AmeriCorps members who will coordinate a range of educational programs, provide direct service, recruit/supervise volunteers, expand outreach, develop curricula, and assist with program evaluation, at the RCLC, the Notre Dame Center for Arts and Culture (NDCAC), the YMCA Urban Youth Services, and the OC Carmichael Boys and Girls Club. At the end of the 1st program year the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for improving educational outcomes for 350 local youth. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 550 volunteers that will engage in tutoring, implementing afterschool enrichment programs, and teaching conflict resolution/violence prevention.
