

Louisiana FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Louisiana. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to Volunteer Louisiana, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Louisiana are projected to earn \$3,619,259 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Southeast Louisiana proposes to have 46 AmeriCorps (Minimum Time) members who will implement the Project Learn Initiative (a strategy for enhancing the impact of youth development programs) in Boys & Girls Club sites in New Orleans, Covington, Gretna and Slidell, Louisiana. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for improvements in academic attitudes and academic success of 294 low income youth. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 500 volunteers who will be engaged in tutoring, mentoring, administrative support, and Club improvement projects.
