

## Maryland FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Maryland. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to the Maryland Governor's Office on Service and Volunteerism, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in Maryland that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Maryland are projected to earn \$6,430,343 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

### Program Summary

HIAS, a national refugee resettlement agency, proposes to place a full-time AmeriCorps member in ten of its affiliate organizations. These ten Refugee AmeriCorps members will provide support to and facilitate access to services and resources that contribute to the improved economic well-being and security of vulnerable refugees in the following communities: San Diego, California; Clearwater, Florida; Springfield, Massachusetts; Buffalo, New York; Charlotte, North Carolina; Cleveland and Columbus, Ohio; Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; and Seattle, Washington.
