

Oklahoma FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Oklahoma. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to the Oklahoma Community Service Commission, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Oklahoma are projected to earn \$2,347,563 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

Program Summary

50 City Year AmeriCorps members will provide in-school and after-school tutoring and mentoring to 3rd to 10th grade students who are at risk to drop out in 6 Tulsa, Oklahoma public schools. At the end of the program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for providing in-class and school climate support to benefit 920 students and targeted tutoring and mentoring to at least 300 students that improves 240 drop out risk indicators in attendance, English and/or math. The AmeriCorps members will leverage 150. The CNCS investment of \$625,000 will leverage \$1,557,470 [\$500,000 in local public funding and \$1.057M in private funding].

Program Summary

Jennings School, through the Lead to Read AmeriCorps Program, proposes to have 36 AmeriCorps members who will provide evidence based one-on-one and small group literacy instruction and reading strategies to underachieving students in poverty, grades kindergarten through 4th in 15 elementary schools in 15 school districts located in eight rural and remote counties of Oklahoma. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for helping 75% of students reach grade level literacy benchmarks. The AmeriCorps members at each site will leverage a minimum of 10 volunteers to participate in school-based service projects. The CNCS investment of \$239,367 will be matched with \$176,719.

Program Summary

The Serve for Success/AmeriCorps (Okeene Public Schools intermediary grantee) will have 66 AmeriCorps members who will tutor low performing pre-k through 12 grade students in thirteen rural Oklahoma school districts: Alva, Canton, Cimarron, Dover, Drummond, Fairview, Geary, Kingfisher, Okeene, Pond Creek-Hunter, Ringwood, Waynoka and Saints Peter and Paul Catholic School in Kingfisher. At the end 1st program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for increased academic performance. The AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 600 student volunteers. The CNCS investment of \$363,749.00 will be matched with \$383,860.00, \$212,046.00 cash from each participating school district and \$171,814.00 in-kind from partner school districts.

Program Summary

Teach For America-Oklahoma will have 310 AmeriCorps (AC) members who will serve as full-time teachers in low-income schools and early childhood centers in Tulsa and Oklahoma City, Lawton, El Reno, and Muskogee. The AC members will be responsible for increasing academic outcomes for over 17,000 students. AC members will leverage an additional 300 volunteers to engage in supporting Oklahoma students in our classrooms. The CNCS investment of \$234,670 while not requiring a match, will be supplemented by \$3,146,664 in public funding and \$7,658,150 in private funding.
