

Oregon FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Oregon. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to Oregon Volunteers, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in Oregon that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Oregon are projected to earn \$1,392,926 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

Program Summary

Boys & Girls Clubs of Portland proposes to have 27 full-time and 16 quarter-time AmeriCorps members execute a high impact, evidence-based academic support and mentorship program STEM Connect in 11 organizations across 13 counties in Oregon. Members will serve in the unique capacity-building role of "School-Club Connectors." At the end of the first program year, Connectors will be responsible for increasing academic engagement for 4,300 students ages 5-18. The CNCS investment of \$380,052 will be matched by the BGCP with \$257,761 in private funding raised through foundations, private giving and program fees.

Program Summary

College Possible Portland proposes to have 20 AmeriCorps members who will prepare low-income students for success in post-secondary education through academic and college preparation programming in Portland, OR. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for helping students demonstrate improved academic performance in literacy and math, as well as increased preparation for higher education and careers through college admission and persistence. The AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 231 volunteers. The CNCS investment of \$240,000 will be matched with \$390,000, \$240,000 in public funding and \$150,000 in private funding.

Program Summary

Heart of Oregon Corps proposes to have 59 part-time and 5 full-time AC members who will improve their own economic opportunities while they conduct environmental stewardship projects located in three counties (Deschutes, Jefferson, and Crook) and tribal lands within the Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs. At the end of the first program year, the AC members will improve 1,000 acres and 50 miles of trails/waterways on public lands while AC members will secure employment (20 members) and complete a college course (20 members), thereby significantly improving their own economic futures. The AC members will leverage an additional 50 volunteers. The CNCS investment of \$383,840 will be matched with \$409,037 in public funding from federal, state, and local partners.

Program Summary

The Jesuit Volunteer Corps Northwest (JVCNW) AmeriCorps program proposes to have 142 AmeriCorps members who will serve in remote, rural, and urban economically challenged areas in 109 nonprofits, schools and community health clinics to build sustainable capacity for nonprofit partners; teach and mentor economically disadvantaged children to improve their academic engagement and success in school; and increase access for preventative and primary health care to underserved individuals in 21 locales in five states: Alaska, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for enhancing and/or expanding programming for nonprofits with the creation of 195 sustainable, new or enhanced systems and business processes; increasing the academic engagement of 124 students with high academic and personal needs; providing health access for 4,500 underserved individuals. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 8,000 volunteers who will be engaged in supporting the missions of partner nonprofits. This program will focus on the CNCS focus areas of Capacity Building, Education and Healthy Futures as a multi-focus intermediary. The CNCS investment of \$1,560,540 will be matched with \$1,500,824.

Program Summary

Northwest Youth Corps (NYC) proposes to host 39 AmeriCorps Members, who will reduce wildfire danger and invasive weeds, and improve trails in the rural areas of Jackson, Coos, Lake, Klamath, Josephine, and/or Umatilla counties. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps Members will benefit from industry recognized job-training to increase their employability, as they improve 316 acres of land, and create or maintain 58 miles of public trails. The AmeriCorps Members will leverage an additional 50 volunteers. The CNCS investment of \$175,820 will be matched with \$287,004 in state, local, or federal funds, and \$12,000 in private funding.
