

Pennsylvania FY2015 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Pennsylvania. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to PennSERVE, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in Pennsylvania that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,730. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Pennsylvania are projected to earn \$3,770,428 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

AmeriCorps members in Philadelphia, who will be economically disadvantaged National Service participants and unemployed prior to their term of service, will be responsible for 500 individuals receiving emergency food from food banks and pantries. Over the course of three years, 70% of members who are enrolled as students will make gains on the Test of Basic Education, 75% will earn a vocational certification, and 70% will earn a high school diploma.
