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OUR OPPORTUNITIES

AmeriCorps NCCC is a full-time, residential program in which young adults travel the country in teams completing national and community service projects. There are two paths to service, FEMA Corps and Traditional Corps.



- 10 months of service (11 months for Team Leaders)
- Work with local project sponsors, including nonprofits, state and municipal governments, and faith-based groups
- Serve on direct, hands-on projects
- Travel within one of four regions of the United States



FEMA Corps

- 12 months of service
- Work directly with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) on disaster preparedness and response projects
- Serve in an administrative capacity, typically in an office setting
- Travel throughout the United States

Within each of these paths are two roles:

CORPS MEMBER

- 18-24 years old
- Serve on a team of 8-12 other members

TEAM LEADER

- 18 years and older (no upper age limit)
- Supervise a team of 8-12 members

OUR BENEFITS

A term of service comes with many benefits. Members build lasting relationships, gain excellent professional experience, are exposed to many different career options, and often find a sense of direction for future career or educational endeavors. They also receive:

BENEFITS DURING SERVICE



Basic expenses are covered, including communal housing, meals and health care.



All program-related travel, including to training locations, to projects, and home after service.



We provide a modest living allowance for personal expenses during service.



Members receive valuable training in various technical skills, leadership development, teamwork, and more.

BENEFITS AFTER SERVICE

Successful graduates of NCCC receive an Education Award of over \$6,000 to use for future tuition costs or loans.



We maintain a network of over 600 Employers of National Service, which can help aid NCCC alums in their job search.



OUR IMPACT

NCCC Alumni report significant levels of impact in the areas of personal growth, cross-cultural understanding, and feelings of community during service.

Requirements to Serve

Be 18-24 years of age (no upper age limit for Team leaders)

Be willing to leave their hometown and serve full-time for 10-12 months (see page 4-5 for service term lengths for each program)

Be a lawful permanent resident or citizen of the United States (citizenship required for FEMA Corps applicants)

Possess an interest in strengthening communities and a willingness to put the needs of one's projects and team ahead of one's own personal comforts

Be flexible, willing to work on a variety of projects, and able to work with a diverse group of peers

Travel is both a requirement to serve and a benefit that is unique to NCCC. Our members come from all over the country, are assigned to 1 of our 4 campuses, and then deploy to projects all over the country. While each member will have a unique adventure in service, a few example member experiences are mapped below.


EXAMPLE MEMBER ROADMAPS
