

**Pennsylvania FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet**

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Pennsylvania. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to PennSERVE: The Governor’s Office of Citizen Service, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Pennsylvania are projected to earn \$3,122,472 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

### **Program Summary**

City Year Greater Philadelphia proposes to have 205 full-time AmeriCorps members who will provide academic services that support students in staying in school and on track to graduation in 16 Philadelphia public schools. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for providing in-class and school climate support to benefit 4,500 students and targeted tutoring and mentoring to 1,305 students that improves 755 drop out risk indicators in attendance, English and/or math. The AmeriCorps members will leverage 1,900 volunteers. The CNCS investment of \$2,297,165 will be matched with \$2,297,165 [\$1,250,308 in public funding and \$1,046,857 in private funding].

At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for providing educational skills about chronic disease prevention and management to a minimum of 20,000 under-served youth and adults, as well as assisting a minimum of 20,000 new under-served youth and adults to access health and social services. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 3,000 volunteers, who will be engaged in connecting under-served youth and adults with health and wellness education, benefits and services. The program will focus on the CNCS focus area of Healthy Futures.

YouthBuild Philadelphia Charter School will have 49 minimum-time AmeriCorps members and 3 full-time members who are unemployed prior to their term of service. At the end of the first program year, the quarter-time AmeriCorps members and 3 full-time members will be responsible for 700 individuals receiving emergency food. Over the course of the three year program, 70% of our students will improve on the Test of Basic Education, 70% will earn a vocational certification, and 70% will earn a high school diploma. Our 52 AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 50 volunteers. The CNCS investment of \$123,632 will be matched with \$126,411 in State/local funding from the School District of Philadelphia (non-federal), which is secured for the 2016-17 program year.

### **Program Summary**

Up2Us Sports, through our AmeriCorps Coach Across America (CAA) Program, proposes to have 20 AmeriCorps members serve as coach-mentors to provide sports-based youth development mentoring in North and West Philadelphia. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will ensure that 1,800 youth have been engaged in physical activity to reduce obesity and avoid negative behaviors like violence. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 240 volunteers. The CNCS investment of \$127,500 will be matched with \$185,989, \$0 in public funding and \$185,989 in private funding.
