What Is The Social Innovation Fund (SIF)?

The Social Innovation Fund (SIF), a program of the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS), combines public and private resources to grow the impact of innovative, community-based solutions that have compelling evidence of improving the lives of people in low-income communities throughout the United States. The SIF invests in three priority areas: economic opportunity, healthy futures, and youth development. The SIF makes grants to experienced grantmaking institutions that are well-positioned within communities to identify the most promising programs and guide them towards greater impact and stronger evidence of success. In addition to funding, Social Innovation Fund recipients receive significant technical assistance to support implementation of their innovative programs.

Who Can Apply?

This competition is open to existing grantmaking institutions (organizations that provide grants to nonprofits as an essential means of fulfilling their mission) or eligible partnerships (between grantmakers, a State Commission on National and Community Service, or a chief executive officer of a unit of general local government where the partner organizations will share responsibilities under the award). Affiliated Network organizations that are existing grantmaking institutions are also eligible to apply if they are willing to grant SIF dollars through competitions that are open beyond their exclusive networks. Current SIF Classic recipients may apply for new interventions; however, previous funding from CNCS or another federal agency is not a requisite to apply.

What Are We Looking For?

The SIF seeks recipients who will run open competitions to select, fund, support, and evaluate community-based nonprofit organizations that are growing promising, innovative approaches to overcoming challenges facing local communities in the areas of youth development (preparing youth for success in school, active citizenship, productive work, and healthy and safe lives), economic opportunity (increasing economic opportunities for economically disadvantaged individuals) and healthy futures (promoting healthy lifestyles and reducing the risk factors that can lead to illness). There is a special emphasis this year on three additional finding priorities. These include first: early childhood education for the expansion of access to high quality early learning for children age five that prepares them for lifelong success. Second, the utilization of technology to increase impact of the proposed evidence-based social programs. Third, place based strategies that improve outcomes for youth involved in the juvenile justice system.

What Are The Funding Amounts?

The SIF will award up to \$39 million in grants during the 2016 fiscal year. Each selected recipient will be awarded between \$1 million and \$10 million and will match every federal dollar of the grant award. At least 80 percent of awarded federal funds must be invested in subrecipient programs.

Why Should You Apply For A Social Innovation Fund Grant?

We all know that progress on our social challenges has been too slow and limited resources have been spent on approaches that do not work. We need innovation that will help achieve faster, longer lasting progress, as opposed to marginal or incremental progress on our social problems. We must help effective organizations grow their impact and transform more lives by investing in cost-effective, evidence-based approaches that lead to better results for the public good. The SIF is designed to help funders who share these beliefs by significantly increasing resources and attention to this important work, and supporting evaluation and expansion efforts through government funding and a robust network of peers. SIF recipients are a part of the leading edge of high-performing, impact-oriented grantmakers that are serious about disrupting the status quo and accelerating solutions that work.

How Do You Apply?

STEP 1 – GET FAMILIAR:

Prospective applicants must read the 2015 SIF Classic Notice of Funding Availability to familiarize their self with our priorities and expectations. On the SIF NOFA webpage, you can also find materials from the previous competitions that may help you better understand the SIF and our work. STEP 2 – NOTICE OF INTENT:

Please visit <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/VJ32PZS> to submit your Notice of Intent. Be prepared to submit the following information: the name of the applicant organization and its address; the name, email address, and phone number for the primary contact person; and the Issue Area(s) the anticipated application will address. Please be sure that the primary contact is authorized to correspond on behalf of the organization.

STEP 3 – PREPARE AND APPLY:

Prepare your responses and submit applications electronically via eGrants, CNCS' web-based application system: <https://egrants.cns.gov/espan/main/login.jsp>. Give yourself plenty of time. Successful applicants will be in August 2016.

When Do You Need To Apply?

The Notice of Intent deadline is April 15, 2016 and the Application deadline is May 10, 2016 at 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time.
