

Virginia FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Virginia. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to the Office of Volunteerism and Community Service, Virginia Dept. of Social Service, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in Virginia that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Virginia are projected to earn \$3,056,929 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

Catholic Charities USA proposes to have 24 AmeriCorps members assisting with the provision of refugee resettlement services in areas centered on the following cities: Atlanta, GA; Des Moines, IA; Chicago, IL; New Orleans, LA; Jefferson City, MO; NJ, Camden; Buffalo, NY; New York, NY; Rochester, NY; Syracuse, NY; Cincinnati, OH; Pittsburgh, PA; Nashville, TN; Fort Worth, TX; Houston, TX and San Antonio, TX. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for assisting with the resettlement, resulting in self-sufficiency, of 3,000 individual refugees. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 100 volunteers who will be engaged in providing resources and/or cultural orientation to the refugees. This program will focus on the CNCS focus area of economic opportunity. The CNCS investment of \$271,491 will be matched with \$415,094.

Each year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for having assisted 825 Veterans, and 125 military family members with accessing their benefits and meeting other health, mental health, educational and social service needs. Program Summary

The Ethiopian Community Development Council, Inc. (ECDC) proposes to have 10 Refugee AmeriCorps members. Nine will provide refugees with culturally- and linguistically-appropriate job readiness services at ECDC affiliates located in San Diego, Calif.; Denver, Colo.; Clearwater and Tampa, Fla.; Houston, TX.; Omaha, Neb.; Las Vegas, Nev.; Greensboro, N.C.; and Nashville, Tenn. One member will provide educational services to refugee youth at ECDC's affiliate in Silver Spring, Md. At the end of the first program year, Refugee AmeriCorps members will have helped 450 refugees on a path to economic self-sufficiency and 40 refugee youth will have received the support needed for their academic success in the U.S. Members also will leverage 180 volunteers who will provide job readiness training, teach English-as-a-Second Language (ESL) and Vocational English-as-a-Second Language (VESL), and 20 volunteers who will tutor and mentor refugee youth. ECDC's Refugee AmeriCorps Project is being conducted in partnership with the Department of Health and Human Services' Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) under the Preferred Communities (PC) Intensive Case Management Program. On ECDC's behalf, ORR has consulted with the state commissions. The project period is September 30, 2015-September 29, 2016, and reflects the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) focus areas of Economic Opportunity and Education.
