

Washington FY2016 AmeriCorps State & National Grant Coversheet

Below is a breakdown of the funding being awarded to Washington. The state competitive funding and state formula funding will be granted to Serve Washington, the governor-appointed State Service Commission. The Commission will, in turn, award grants to nonprofit organizations and/or public agencies responding to local needs across the state. In addition, funding is also being awarded to one or more national direct grantees, which are organizations headquartered in Washington that support AmeriCorps members serving in more than one state.

In addition to the grant funding awarded to organizations, individual AmeriCorps members who complete at least 1,700 hours of service will earn Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards valued at \$5,775. These awards may be used to pay for college or vocational training or to pay back student loans. Through the state competitive grants alone, AmeriCorps members in Washington are projected to earn \$7,004,552 in Education Awards to support their pursuit of higher education.

EarthCorps will have 30 AmeriCorps members who will deliver watershed restoration services including invasive plant removal, native planting, slope stabilization/erosion control and trailwork at project sites in parks and natural areas primarily in King, Pierce and Snohomish Counties, in Washington State. At the end of the 1st program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for documented ecological improvements to 100 acres of land. The AmeriCorps members will recruit and manage an additional 10,000 community volunteers who will contribute 32,000 hours of restoration activities.

Program Summary

The Mt. Adams Institute (MAI) proposes to have 44.91 MSY (58 members) who will engage in its career development and stewardship programs (VetsWork Environment, VetsWork GreenCorps and Public Lands Stewards) focused on public lands and natural resources management in eleven states: WA, OR, MO, AR, IL, IN, VA, WV, NC, SC and GA. At the end of the first year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for having developed skills, knowledge and professional networks that will help them secure permanent employment in the sector. Members will have also improved over 1,500 acres of public lands and built/maintained over 800 miles of public hiking trails. This program will focus on the CNCS focus areas of Veterans and Military Families and Environmental Stewardship. The CNCS investment of \$499,489 will be matched with \$792,000 in public funding.

The Washington Conservation Corps (WCC) proposes to have 285 AmeriCorps members (young adults and military veterans) who will complete the following: 1) remove invasive species and install native plants to improve habitat for fish and wildlife, 2) increase access and safety through construction or improvement of trails 3) reduce the risk of floods and wildfires through forest health management and 4) assist in disaster response. Environmental service activities will be completed in 18 Washington counties. Disaster services will be completed nationwide, through CNCS mission assignments. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for treating 4,000 acres and improving 1,200 acres of public lands, constructing or improving 400 miles of trails, leading service learning projects for 10,000 students, and assisting 200 individuals during disaster response.

The Washington Reading Corps (WRC) will have 150 full-time AmeriCorps members who will provide evidence-based reading tutoring to students, based on assessed needs, one-on-one and in small groups of no more than six, through intensive 20-minute sessions at least three times a week in approximately 75 high-needs schools and early learning centers throughout Washington State. Members will be responsible for 3,300 students increasing one grade level in reading proficiency or meeting curriculum-based literacy benchmarks by the end of the first program year. Members will also leverage an additional 3,000 volunteers that will partner with members to provide the same type and intensity of tutoring.

Program Summary

Washington Campus Compact/Western Washington University will have 56 AmeriCorps members serving in the College Access Corps. Members will recruit, train and place 500 college student volunteers to serve as College Access Coaches for economically disadvantaged (ED) K-12 youth in the states of Washington and Oregon. Specifically, members and coaches will deliver a minimum of 15 hours of the following interventions to each of the 3,612 participating ED K-12: 1) provide academic coaching, 2) engage youth in service-learning, 3) teach study and test-taking skills, 4) provide information about post-secondary educational benefits and financial aid opportunities, 5) assist with college and financial aid applications, 6) coordinate campus visits, 7) coordinate FAFSA workshops, and 8) facilitate college fairs. At the end of the first program year, at least 70% of participating ED K-12 youth will report improvement in academic engagement, academic preparedness for post-secondary education, and knowledge about how to apply to and pay for post-secondary education per a pre- and post-survey. Additionally, the AmeriCorps members will recruit 1,580 volunteers (including ED K-12 youth) who will be engaged in national days of service. The College Access Corps program will concentrate on the CNCS focus area of Education.

The Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs (WDVA) will have fifty (50) AmeriCorps members who will act as peer mentor/ navigators to veterans and military families at colleges and with community partner sites across Washington State. At the end of the first program year, the AmeriCorps members will be responsible for outreach to 9,000 veterans and or family members on and off campus, connecting 400 individuals to services and benefits, as well as training for 1,500 faculty, staff, administrators and community stakeholder on veterans' cultural competency and veterans transition increasing success in veterans' transition from military service. In addition, the AmeriCorps members will leverage an additional 2,000 volunteers that will be engaged in service projects that support and raise awareness of veterans' across Washington State.
