<p>Community Need: The North Fork Blood Center provides over 300 units of blood and blood products per year to the area hospital through local blood drives,. The blood drives are the only source for the life-saving blood products provided to the North Fork County Health Center. The blood products are vital to surgery, cancer, leukemia, burn, transplant, and accident patients treated at the facility. Keeping an adequate blood supply in store is an ongoing challenge, and repeat blood donors are key to ensuring that rural North Fork County has an adequate supply of blood. According to the Director of the North Fork Blood Center, RSVP volunteers play an important role in sustaining and increasing the number of repeat blood donors. The volunteers achieve this through recruitment and outreach, and by performing tasks that streamline the blood donation process and ensure a satisfactory (comfortable and efficient) blood giving experience.</p>	
<p>Service Activity: Volunteer outreach and recruitment activities include posting signs in the community to help raise blood drive awareness, and making calls to recruit donors to ensure that all previous donors have a chance to make an appointment. To streamline onsite blood donation processes, volunteers register donors as they arrive; transport blood products to the blood center; update profiles of blood donors, and assist in other ways as needed.</p>	
<p>Anticipated Input: The North Fork Blood Center will hold blood drives for ten one-day blood draws each year. Four RSVP volunteers will serve 20 hours per blood drive, performing all needed functions before, during, and after each blood draw as assigned by the North Fork Blood Center, for a total of 800 volunteer hours per year. Each volunteer will receive one hour of orientation and written literature from the Blood Center staff for each blood drive.</p>	
<p>Anticipated Accomplishment/Outputs: Blood donors will donate blood to maintain an ongoing blood supply in the area.</p>	
<p>Indicator: Number of blood donors; number of units of blood drawn</p>	
<p>Target: 135 blood donors will provide 450 units of blood.</p>	
<p>How measured? Blood Drive Tally Sheet. (The Blood Drive Tally Sheets will be compiled and results reported by the RSVP Director. The Tally Sheets will record the number of donors, and the number of units of blood drawn.)</p>	

Anticipated Intermediate Impact/Outcome: Blood donors participating in the North Fork County Blood drives will have a satisfactory blood draw experience.

Indicator: Percent of blood donors responding “satisfied” or “very satisfied” to at least four of six questions asking about their blood donation experience

Target: Eighty percent of blood donors will respond “satisfied” or “very satisfied” to at least at least four of six questions asking about their blood donation experience.

How measured? Blood Donor Survey, administered to blood donors by RSVP volunteers. Satisfaction questions are scaled as “very satisfied,” “satisfied,” “neutral,” “dissatisfied,” and “very dissatisfied.”

Anticipated End Impact/Outcome: There will be an increase in repeat blood donors.

Indicators: (1) Percent of blood donors surveyed during the FIRST FOUR MONTHS of the program year who report having donated blood at North Fork County facilities on more than one occasion in the previous year. (2) Percent of blood donors surveyed during the LAST FOUR MONTHS of the program year who report having donated blood at North Fork County facilities on more than one occasion in the previous year.

Target: Compared to respondents surveyed during the first four months of the program year, 20 percent more of respondents surveyed during the last four months of the program year will report having donated blood at North Fork County facilities on more than one occasion in the previous year.

How measured? Blood Donor Survey, administered to blood donors by RSVP volunteers.
