<p>Community Need: The events of September 11, 2001, underscore the need for members of the community to be knowledgeable in basic disaster preparedness and emergency response techniques, such as CPR and first aid. In addition, Beatty County is situated near the San Martinez earthquake fault line, and according to the Beatty County Public Health Department, in 2003 fewer than one in ten residents had received formal training in basic lifesaving techniques such as CPR. The Beatty County American Red Cross Chapter has put out a request for volunteers to assist in educating the community in basic emergency response techniques such as CPR and first aid.</p>	
<p>Service Activity: Ten RSVP volunteers will be trained and certified to teach community first aid and safety trainings to residents of Beatty County. The RSVP volunteers will hold informational meetings at local public spaces such as the library, respond to requests for information about upcoming trainings, identify community groups interested in receiving training, schedule training sessions, and conduct the trainings over a ten month period. Trainings will last five and one-half hours and take place twice a month. Participants at trainings will learn to recognize emergencies and respond immediately. Trainings will cover adult, child, and infant CPR; and first aid techniques for treating cuts, scrapes, bruises, burns, bleeding, sprains and strains, as well as poisonings and heat or cold emergencies. It is expected that at least 480 adults in Beatty County will complete this training over the year.</p>	
<p>Anticipated Input: Ten RSVP volunteers will serve 20 hours per month conducting outreach, organizing, and delivering training sessions to residents of Beatty County. Trainings will take place at local community centers, senior centers, schools, local businesses, and other public and private facilities. The Beatty County Red Cross Chapter will provide 24 hours of training for RSVP volunteers to become instructors. The RSVP project and the Beatty County American Red Cross Chapter will collaborate to provide orientation and on-going support to RSVP volunteers. RSVP will provide the volunteers with mileage reimbursements and recognition.</p>	
<p>Anticipated Accomplishments/Outputs: Beatty County residents seek information about the first aid and safety trainings.</p>	
<p>Indicator: Number of Beatty County residents who attend informational meetings or phone the Beatty County Red Cross requesting information about trainings</p>	
<p>Target: Six hundred Beatty County residents will show interest in attending a first aid and safety training by request information or attending informational meetings held periodically.</p>

Anticipated Intermediate Impact/Outcome: Beatty County residents will be recruited to participate in the community first aid and safety trainings.

Indicator: Number of Beatty County residents who sign up for community first aid and safety trainings.

Target: Five hundred Beatty County residents will sign up for the community first aid and safety trainings over the year.

How Measured? *Training Log*

Anticipated End Impact/Outcome: Beatty County residents will learn skills in first aid and safety precautions.

Indicator: Percent of training participants who demonstrate first aid/safety skills and receive certification.

Target: Eighty (80) percent of the residents that attend the training will demonstrate first aid/safety skills and receive American Red Cross CPR and First Aid Certificates.
