<p>Community Need to be Addressed:</p> <p>There are high levels of illiteracy and poverty in both Sumter and Greene Counties. The need for reading assistances is great. 91% of children live below the poverty level; and less than 60% of all students are reading at appropriate grade levels. Many students demonstrate poor reading skills in grade three. Research by the Barge Johnson Group, a local education evaluation organization, indicates that if a student cannot read by the third grade, they are almost destined to fail all other core subjects, unless strong intervention is offered. The research also indicate that a strong reading program can make a difference in the lives of third grade students. Therefore, we will target our efforts to third graders. The majority are reading on first and second grade level; some do not have a strong grasp of syllabic structures of words such as "hel-lo" and "good-bye." In fact, many students don't have the knowledge of individual sounds of words such as "c-a-t", "m-a-n." We have chosen third grade because we feel we can make the most difference through volunteers who have a strong command of languagae arts and reading skills.</p>

<p>Community Need to be Addressed:</p> <p>According to the Greene and Sumter County Alabama 2011 School District reports, 91% of the children live in poverty and are eligible for free breakfast and lunch. 31% of these youth ages 10-17 demonstrate delayed social skill development, behavior problems and poor academic performance. 45% of these youth have been identified as children of inmates and have been flagged as "critical need students in order to succeed in school. Volunteers will work toward improving self-confidence, self-esteem and improving their grades. Schools have reported that without intervention students with poor reading skills are at-risk of failing to advance to the next grade.</p>
