In partnership with non-profits, local municipalities, state governments, federal government, national or state parks, Indian Tribes and schools, members complete service projects throughout the region they are assigned.</p>	<p>VISTA provides volunteers to support projects at nonprofit, grassroots organizations, and local government agencies that operate programs to help alleviate poverty in the United States. VISTAs strengthen and support these organizations by improving their infrastructure and supporting community partnerships, securing long-term resources, training program participants, and developing other activities that help build long-term sustainability for overcoming poverty.</p>
