MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

More than 4,300 people of all ages and backgrounds are helping to meet local needs, strengthen communities, and increase civic engagement through national service in the District of Columbia. Serving at more than 360 locations throughout the state, these citizens tutor and mentor children, support veterans and military families, provide health services, restore the environment, respond to disasters, increase economic opportunity, and recruit and manage volunteers.

This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$30,130,000 to support District of Columbia communities through national service initiatives. CNCS invests in cost-effective community solutions--working hand in hand with local partners to improve lives, expand economic opportunity, and engage citizens in solving problems in their communities. Serving in many of the state's most impoverished communities, CNCS provides vital support to schools, food banks, homeless shelters, community health clinics, youth centers, veterans service facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations at a time of growing demand for services. Through a unique public-private partnership, this federal investment will leverage an additional \$20,190,000 in other resources to strengthen community impact, build local support, and increase return on taxpayer dollars.

AmeriCorps: This year AmeriCorps will provide more than 3,600 individuals the opportunity to provide intensive, results-driven service to meet education, environmental, health, economic, and other pressing needs in communities across the District of Columbia. Most AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the Serve DC, which in turn awards grants to nonprofit groups to respond to local needs. Most of the remainder of the grant funding is distributed by CNCS directly to multi-state and national organizations through a competitive grants process. Other individuals serve through AmeriCorps VISTA, whose members help bring individuals and communities out of poverty by serving full-time to fight illiteracy, improve health services, create businesses, and increase housing opportunities, and AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps), a 10-month, full time residential program for men and women between the ages of 18 and 24. In exchange for their service, AmeriCorps members earn an education award that can be used to pay for college or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 5,100 District of Columbia residents have served more than 7.3 million hours and have qualified for Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$16,090,000.

Senior Corps: More than 710 seniors in the District of Columbia contribute their time and talents in one of three Senior Corps programs. Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to more than 8,100 young people who have special needs. Senior Companions help more than 290 homebound seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes. RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services through more than 41 groups across the District of Columbia.

Social Innovation Fund: The Social Innovation Fund transforms lives and communities using limited federal investment as a catalyst to grow the impact of nonprofits with evidence of strong results. It harnesses the expertise of grantmaking intermediaries to identify, evaluate and expand effective nonprofits and engages funding partners to contribute nearly three dollars to every one federal dollar invested. As the Social Innovation Fund network grows programs that work in the District of Columbia, more people are able to overcome their most pressing challenges in the areas of economic opportunity, health, and youth development. The Social Innovation Fund is investing \$4,670,000 in expanding the impact of 11 nonprofits in the District of Columbia, selected and supported by 3 intermediaries.

The Corporation for National and Community Service is a federal agency that improves lives, strengthens communities, and fosters civic engagement through service and volunteering. CNCS annually engages more than five million Americans in service to meet local needs through Senior Corps, AmeriCorps, and national days of service; improves communities through the Social Innovation Fund, and leads President Obama's national call to service initiative, United We Serve. Notes: The data shown represents a snapshot in time. CNCS project sites, participants, and funding change throughout the year, so the data may not reflect current conditions.

- This figure represents the number of awarded positions available to be filled in the 2013 - 2014 program year. For AmeriCorps VISTA, this represents the actual number of VISTA members in active service.
- This figure represents the maximum potential value of Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards that can be earned by AmeriCorps members serving in District of Columbia. The award can be used in any state to pay for college, graduate school, vocational training, or to pay back student loans. The education award total is included in total CNCS funding.
- AmeriCorps National figures may include national programs headquartered in the state and/or operating sites of national programs that are headquartered in other states. Funding reflects the estimated proportionate share of the national grant associated with operating sites in this report. Some national organizations do not report operating site data, or it was not available at time of publishing, so figures may not reflect current conditions.
- District of Columbia is served by the AmeriCorps NCCC campus located in Perry Point, Maryland. In the past year, AmeriCorps NCCC teams have served on projects in Washington.
- The service location total may contain multiple counts of unique locations where multiple CNCS programs are operating.
- As part of its public-private partnership approach, CNCS requires grantees to leverage additional resources to strengthen community impact and increase the return on the federal investment. This figure reflects non-CNCS cash and in-kind resources that CNCS grantees and project sponsors have committed to raise to support their programming activities across the state.

National Service Impact in the District of Columbia

AmeriCorps

In 2012-2013, the Center for Inspired Teaching engaged 28 full-time AmeriCorps members serving in Washington, DC. The Center for Inspired Teaching is building a better school experience for children by helping teachers move from information providers to instigators of thought. As demonstrated by assessment, more than 150 students in early childhood classrooms of Inspired Teaching Fellows received a quality literacy instruction, and demonstrated measurable gains in school readiness in terms of foundational literacy and writing skills in the 2012-2013 school year. Additionally, AmeriCorps members provided high-quality literacy instruction to more than 160 students in DC elementary classrooms, resulting in significant growth throughout the year.

AmeriCorps NCCC

City Year's mission is to build democracy through citizen service, civic leadership, and social entrepreneurship. City Year's In School & On Track initiative is designed to bring City Year AmeriCorps members to 50 percent of all of the students falling off track in City Year's 21 U.S. locations. Through this partnership, an AmeriCorps NCCC team provided 85 elementary school students with tutoring and assisted 827 at-risk youth through the alternate summer break program. This collaboration was a clear demonstration of the impact that national service can make for the betterment of communities across the country. The Atlantic Region campus is particularly proud of this collaboration as the project was developed and managed by a Class XVI graduate from the Perry Point campus.

AmeriCorps VISTA

The See Forever Foundation's Maya Angelou Public Charter Schools in the District of Columbia are in their second year of an AmeriCorps VISTA project that places four members in service in the areas of data analysis, development, student engagement and curriculum design. The foundation strives to design learning communities in lower-income urban areas where all students, particularly those who have not succeeded in traditional schools, can reach their potential and prepare for college, career, and a lifetime of success. At the Maya Angelou Public Charter School High School located east of the Anacostia River in Ward 7, the program is seeing great success as 73 percent of its graduates enroll in college as compared with approximately 50 percent of local low-income African American high school graduates.

Senior Corps

The United Planning Organization's Foster Grandparent Program has more than 200 volunteers serving in the District of Columbia in various types of educational institutions across the city. From JumpStart to JobCorps, District area seniors are making a difference in young people's lives, helping them achieve academic goals. The accomplishments of the DC Foster Grandparent Program have been highlighted in segments on CNN and "Rock Center with Brian Williams," as well as in recent articles in the Washington Post.

Social Innovation Fund

Operating in the Washington, DC, metropolitan area, Venture Philanthropy Partner's (VPP) supports an integrated approach to addressing the education and employment needs of low-income and vulnerable youth and young adults. At scale, the network of VPP-supported nonprofit organizations will directly serve an estimated 20,000 youth. VPP receives annual grants from the Social Innovation Fund of \$2 million per year, which they match dollar-for-dollar. Their six nonprofit subgrantees are collaborating on and contributing data to a common framework that focuses on increasing education and employment outcomes for low-income youth and decreasing the number of disconnected youth in the region. The potential for impact is much greater, as their leveraged investments focus attention on the challenges facing local youth and rigorous evaluations yield lessons with broad implications for the public and youth development sectors.
