MEETING COMMUNITY NEEDS IN FLORIDA

More than 16,000 people of all ages and backgrounds are helping to meet local needs, strengthen communities, and increase civic engagement through national service in Florida. Serving at more than 1,700 locations throughout the state, these citizens tutor and mentor children, support veterans and military families, provide health services, restore the environment, respond to disasters, increase economic opportunity, and recruit and manage volunteers.

This year, the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) will commit more than \$37,260,000 to support Florida communities through national service initiatives. CNCS invests in cost-effective community solutions--working hand in hand with local partners to improve lives, expand economic opportunity, and engage citizens in solving problems in their communities. Serving in many of the state's most impoverished communities, CNCS provides vital support to schools, food banks, homeless shelters, community health clinics, youth centers, veterans service facilities, and other nonprofit and faith-based organizations at a time of growing demand for services. Through a unique public-private partnership, this federal investment will leverage an additional \$16,540,000 in other resources to strengthen community impact, build local support, and increase return on taxpayer dollars.

AmeriCorps: This year AmeriCorps will provide more than 2,300 individuals the opportunity to provide intensive, results-driven service to meet education, environmental, health, economic, and other pressing needs in communities across Florida. Most AmeriCorps grant funding goes to the Volunteer Florida, which in turn awards grants to nonprofit groups to respond to local needs. Most of the remainder of the grant funding is distributed by CNCS directly to multi-state and national organizations through a competitive grants process. Other individuals serve through AmeriCorps VISTA, whose members help bring individuals and communities out of poverty by serving full-time to fight illiteracy, improve health services, create businesses, and increase housing opportunities, and AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps), a 10-month, full time residential program for men and women between the ages of 18 and 24. In exchange for their service, AmeriCorps members earn an education award that can be used to pay for college or to pay back qualified student loans. Since 1994, more than 26,000 Florida residents have served more than 36 million hours and have qualified for Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards totaling more than \$75,490,000.

Senior Corps: More than 14,000 seniors in Florida contribute their time and talents in one of three Senior Corps programs. Foster Grandparents serve one-on-one as tutors and mentors to more than 8,300 young people who have special needs. Senior Companions help more than 2,200 homebound seniors and other adults maintain independence in their own homes. RSVP volunteers conduct safety patrols, renovate homes, protect the environment, tutor and mentor youth, respond to natural disasters, and provide other services through more than 750 groups across Florida.

Social Innovation Fund: The Social Innovation Fund transforms lives and communities using limited federal investment as a catalyst to grow the impact of nonprofits with evidence of strong results. It harnesses the expertise of grantmaking intermediaries to identify, evaluate and expand effective nonprofits and engages funding partners to contribute nearly three dollars to every one federal dollar invested. As the Social Innovation Fund network grows programs that work in Florida, more people are able to overcome their most pressing challenges in the areas of economic opportunity, health, and youth development. The Social Innovation Fund is investing \$1,350,000 in expanding the impact of 2 nonprofits in Florida.

The Corporation for National and Community Service is a federal agency that improves lives, strengthens communities, and fosters civic engagement through service and volunteering. CNCS annually engages more than five million Americans in service to meet local needs through Senior Corps, AmeriCorps, and national days of service; improves communities through the Social Innovation Fund, and leads President Obama's national call to service initiative, United We Serve. - This figure represents the number of awarded positions available to be filled in the 2013 - 2014 program year. For AmeriCorps VISTA, this represents the actual number of VISTA members in active service.
- This figure represents the maximum potential value of Segal AmeriCorps Education Awards that can be earned by AmeriCorps members serving in Florida. The award can be used in any state to pay for college, graduate school, vocational training, or to pay back student loans. The education award total is included in total CNCS funding.
- AmeriCorps National figures may include national programs headquartered in the state and/or operating sites of national programs that are headquartered in other states. Funding reflects the estimated proportionate share of the national grant associated with operating sites in this report. Some national organizations do not report operating site data, or it was not available at time of publishing, so figures may not reflect current conditions.
- The service location total may contain multiple counts of unique locations where multiple CNCS programs are operating.
- As part of its public-private partnership approach, CNCS requires grantees to leverage additional resources to strengthen community impact and increase the return on the federal investment. This figure reflects non-CNCS cash and in-kind resources that CNCS grantees and project sponsors have committed to raise to support their programming activities across the state.

National Service Impact in Florida

AmeriCorps

Florida's AmeriCorps programs created a positive educational climate for 57,324 students through tutoring, mentoring, and educational services in 718 schools. More than 83 percent of students who received a full year of tutoring improved their academic skills. One example is Jenna Gonzalez, a City Year Orlando AmeriCorps member. She serves in a 9th grade English class, working tirelessly to help students improve their grades. She gives students personalized attention through classroom pull-outs and afterschool tutoring. She said that "a student of mine started the month off with an F in English and came up to me last week asking if I could check his grade and now he has a B! I'm so proud of him."

AmeriCorps NCCC

AmeriCorps NCCC team River 3 served with Habitat for Humanity of Greater Miami. The team led a daily average of 150-200 volunteers, totaling 1,706 volunteers at the end of two weeks. AmeriCorps NCCC members started and completed 13 houses and worked on 17 other houses. The team worked alongside 33 families who were directly affected by the work done by River 3. Volunteers who worked with the team had a positive experience and were encouraged to continue volunteering. The team gained skills in both construction and leadership.

AmeriCorps VISTA

To help increase student performance, Heart of Florida United Way, Orange County Public Schools, and six AmeriCorps VISTA members established and support a coalition to build capacity, coordinate programming, manage volunteers, and facilitate interaction between schools, and community partners in Orlando. The VISTA members focus on building partnerships that boost key measurable student outcomes — attendance, behavior and course performance — and improve low-performing schools. In 2012, VISTAs successfully engaged 392 volunteers that contributed approximately 900 hours to assist students and teachers at the target schools.

Senior Corps

As part of efforts to reduce health care costs and support families caring for aging loved ones at home, Seniors in Service of Tampa Inc. has been able to provide respite care through the Senior Companion Program. A 96-year old client was living in a nursing home when the family decided to bring her home and received the services of a SCP volunteer. The SCP volunteer helps preserve the client's dexterity and mental well-being through a series of physical and communication exercises. The client is now 103-years old, and the family acknowledges without the SCP volunteer they would be forced to institutionalize the client in the nursing home.

Social Innovation Fund

Housing Partnership, Inc. (HPI) is implementing a "shared equity homeownership" program to address a decline in homeownership rates among low-income families. The program enables new homebuyers in Palm Beach and Broward counties to partner with a government or nonprofit agency acting as a co-investor to reduce homeownership costs. In return, homebuyers will agree to limit, or share, their equity appreciation to preserve affordability so that the initial public investment can ultimately serve more families. With their annual Social Innovation Fund subgrant of \$130,000 from intermediary NCB Capital Impact and their dollar-for-dollar matching funds, HPI anticipates adding 235 new shared equity homes over five years.

Volunteer Generation Fund

In 2012, Volunteer Florida was awarded a Volunteer Generation Fund grant, which was subgranted to 13 organizations for Volunteer Florida's BEST Neighborhoods Program. BEST Neighborhoods, which stands for "Build, Engage, Sustain, Transform," is a program based on "neighboring," a model concept of community engagement that uses volunteering as a tool to empower, mobilize and facilitate positive changes within communities. Instead of identifying problems, neighboring highlights the strengths in a community and engages leaders within that community to identify needs and create solutions.
