This project will assist three state or local governments or nonprofit organizations to determine the feasibility of using PFS to promote interventions addressing positive youth development, with a focus on 1) juvenile justice or child welfare system-involved youth or youth at risk of entering or crossing over into these systems, and 2) addressing high rates of racial disparity in these systems. Eligibility to compete for these TA services will be targeted to government entities and nonprofit organizations in the states with the highest rates of racial and ethnic disparities in juvenile justice and child welfare system involvement. The ultimate goal of the proposed project is creating positive outcomes for system-involved children and young people and supporting the capacity of systems to implement evidence-based practices that set up these young people for the best possible chance of success in their lives and in their communities

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Alhambra, CA	Pacific AIDS Education Outreach (USC) AIDS United	Pacific AIDS Education and Training Center (PAETC), Keck School of Medicine of USC proposes to collaborate with the Center for Health Justice (CHJ); the Los Angeles County+ University of Southern California Medical Center Rand Schrader 5P21 Clinic (LAC+USC Rand Schrader Clinic), the largest HIV/AIDS primary care provider in the County; and MOSAIC, Inc. (Mysteries of Spiritual Awareness in Communities, a network of over 100 spiritual groups and communities working to address the needs of disenfranchised peoples in LA County) to develop the Prisoner Assistance Network (PAN). The initiative will provide re-entry services for people living with HIV/AIDS (PLWHA), leaving incarceration and returning to LA County, who are over 18, low or no income, and of any gender. This population has a disproportionate incidence of substance abuse and mental health issues. PAN will be initiated within Los Angeles County Men's Central Jail (MCJ) and within men and women's California State Prisons. Inmates living with HIV will be screened and linked to medical and mental health services and to substance abuse treatment, housing, job placement, and other needed social services outside corrections facilities, as they reintegrate back into their communities. Estimated number of individuals to be served annually by PAN is 60.

While it has been proven that 86 percent of Genesys Works' students persist beyond the first year of college, GreenLight's SIF Initiative will determine its students' persistence throughout college and other variables that impact student's entry to the economic mainstream, which will provide important evidence to the field of college persistence and career readiness.
