Cambridge, MA	Harvard Social Impact Bond Lab (Pay for Success)	The SIB Lab has been providing government-side technical assistance on designing and implementing Pay for Success (PFS) projects for the past three years. The project builds upon the SIB Lab's model of technical assistance but is oriented toward the next stage of development in the PFS field. The project includes four major components: 1. Two national competitions, in the fall of 2014 and the fall of 2015, to select a total of ten Government Partners who will receive full-time technical assistance from the SIB Lab over the course of 15 months to assist with a PFS project. The SIB Lab will select for those innovative or path-breaking projects that most advance the PFS model; 2. In each competition, one or two of the five partners will be a group of several governments rather than a single government, allowing the SIB Lab to test a cohort-based model of developing government capacity. These groups of governments will share a full-time fellow and will also participate in cross-jurisdictional collaboration and knowledge sharing; 3. The SIB Lab will continue to produce publications that capture and distill the key lessons learned from providing technical assistance and building capacity so that awareness of the PFS model can spread and so that others in the field can benefit; and 4. As part of disseminating lessons learned, the SIB Lab will develop an independent review process that makes its technical assistance expertise available on a short-term basis to governments that seek a brief independent review of a technical aspect of their project development.

Boston, MA	Jobs for the Future/Opportunity Youth Investment Fund	Jobs for the Future and its partner, the Aspen Forum for Community Solutions, seek to improve education and career outcomes for youth disconnected from school or work, also known as Opportunity Youth, in 12 communities across the country. The expectation is that participating youth will earn a diploma or its equivalent and enter postsecondary education at twice the rate of peers who do not receive these services.

Boston, MA	The Boston Foundation	Through its SIF grant, the Boston Foundation will expand its Boston Coaching for Completion, an effort designed to raise post-secondary completion rates, especially for the most vulnerable youth populations in the Boston area.
Boston, MA	Third Sector Capital Partners (Pay for Success)	This project will leverage SIF funding to tackle the most pressing challenge in the PFS field today: how to develop multi-government-level (local, state, federal) contracting and financing for outcomes-driven services. This project has two main focuses to address this challenge: 1. Create a laboratory for testing promising PFS mechanisms and infrastructures, providing assistance to approximately 10 government Sub-Recipients (across two cohorts), selected because they have engaged decision makers from multiple levels of government, have energized local philanthropic support and/or have demonstrated a high degree of PFS readiness. 2. Build capacity to convert the lessons learned in our cohorts and other individual PFS projects into scalable PFS blueprints that will be transferred to a much wider audience by engaging deeply with the leadership organizations for state and local government, as well as for funders.

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Boston, MA	AIDS Action Committee of Massachusetts AIDS United	The AIDS Action Committee of MA implements the Linking for Access and Retention in Comprehensive Care Project with the primary goal of improving the health of people living with HIV/AIDS by providing comprehensive bio/psycho/social support from crisis to stability and self-sufficiency.
Boston, MA	uAspire GreenLight Fund	uAspire aims to provide 11,500 low-income students and families in these communities over the five year engagement with a full understanding of the financial aid available to them. In partnership with schools, community-based organizations and higher education institutions, uAspire's programs follow students (middle school through college) throughout their academic career, and provide group and one-on-one college affordability advising sessions to dispel misconceptions of college affordability. uAspire's unique innovation is its focus on college affordability, collaboration and ability to adapt content and delivery to serve students effectively. uAspire aims to empower low-income students and their families to overcome the financial barriers to higher education, enrollment, persistence and completion. Key outcomes for program impact on students include college affordability awareness and knowledge, engagement with the financial aid process, and postsecondary behavior, including college persistence and completion. Through GreenLight's SIF Initiative, uAspire will evaluate the impact of its continuum of services on students' knowledge, beliefs, and behaviors concerning college affordability.
Newton, MA	Blueprint Schools GreenLight Fund	With its subgrant to Blueprint Schools Network (Blueprint), GreenLight's SIF Initiative will support Blueprint's work with the Boston Public Schools (BPS) to implement its research-based, innovative turnaround model at two level 4 schools: the Elihu Greenwood Leadership Academy (K-5) and The English High School (9-12). Through this work, Blueprint will reach over 1,000 students annually over five years in Boston.
