ABOUT AMERICORPS NCCC

AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) is a full-time, team-based residential program for men and women ages 18-24. AmeriCorps NCCC members are assigned to one of five regional campuses into teams of approximately ten members, and complete 2- to 3-month projects responding to local communities' needs in every state. Teams serve with local and national organizations, infusing resources and leading volunteers for hundreds of organizations like Habitat for Humanity and the American Red Cross. These young adults lead youth development activities, construct and rehabilitate low-income housing, clean up streams, help communities develop emergency plans, and address other pressing local needs.



ABOUT FEMA CORPS

The AmeriCorps NCCC flexible program structure allows both the opportunity to partner with non-profit or government organizations that might lack the capacity to manage longer grant programs, as well as the ability to create strategic collaborations with other national service programs and federal agencies to magnify the impact on communities served. In 2012, AmeriCorps NCCC collaborated with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and created a new unit of members called FEMA Corps. These teams are devoted solely to FEMA disaster preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery efforts, which strengthen the nation's ability to respond to and recover from disasters while expanding career opportunities for young people. Between the traditional and FEMA Corps, up to 2,800 members serve with AmeriCorps NCCC each year.



ABOUT DISASTER RELIEF

In addition to the FEMA Corps, the traditional AmeriCorps NCCC teams are coordinated for rapid disaster deployment anywhere in the country. Trained in CPR, first aid, disaster response and firefighting, teams have responded to local and national disasters since the program was established in 1994. Since 2000, members have served more than 5.1 million hours on 1900 disaster services projects across the nation.

WE'RE GETTING THINGS DONE IN CALIFORNIA

Boulder Creek, CA | Easter Seals Camp Harmon

During an AmeriCorps NCCC team's service with Easter Seals Camp Harmon, the team focused on the rehabilitation of the camp facilities that were left in disrepair due to a lack of funding. The team prepared the camp for campers' arrival and cleaned after the campers left. The team was also responsible for maintaining the grounds around the camp; including gathering leaves, trimming hedges, and moving 1,100 pounds of construction debris. The team's highest priority at Camp Harmon was digging holes to expose septic pipes from a past botched plumbing job. The team dug nearly 75 cubic feet of holes around the camp to find the source of the septic leakage. During their time at Camp Harmon, corps members were able to finish four picnic tables and eight benches as well as cleaning and painting the laundry room.

Los Angeles, CA | Children Youth & Family Collaborative

The Children Youth & Family Collaborative is a nationally recognized, faith-based organization serving over 5,000 foster and underserved youth at 43 sites in Los Angeles, Compton, Montebello and Pomona Unified School Districts. An AmeriCorps NCCC team served with the Community Collaborative Charter School during the spring of 2014 where the team supported in-school and after-school tutoring, leadership development, and life skills training. Corps members assisted during school hours and within the after-school programming at 61st Elementary School, Crenshaw High School, and Dorsey High School. The team assisted in serving over 10,000 meals to students and promoting healthy lifestyles through food based activities. Corps members also tutored over 680 students for a total of 495 hours, working towards improving education for students in the South Los Angeles area.
