ABOUT AMERICORPS NCCC

AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) is a full-time, team-based residential program for men and women ages 18-24. AmeriCorps NCCC members are assigned to one of five regional campuses into teams of approximately ten members, and complete 2- to 3-month projects responding to local communities' needs in every state. Teams serve with local and national organizations, infusing resources and leading volunteers for hundreds of organizations like Habitat for Humanity and the American Red Cross. These young adults lead youth development activities, construct and rehabilitate low-income housing, clean up streams, help communities develop emergency plans, and address other pressing local needs.



ABOUT FEMA CORPS

The AmeriCorps NCCC flexible program structure allows both the opportunity to partner with non-profit or government organizations that might lack the capacity to manage longer grant programs, as well as the ability to create strategic collaborations with other national service programs and federal agencies to magnify the impact on communities served. In 2012, AmeriCorps NCCC collaborated with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and created a new unit of members called FEMA Corps. These teams are devoted solely to FEMA disaster preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery efforts, which strengthen the nation's ability to respond to and recover from disasters while expanding career opportunities for young people. Between the traditional and FEMA Corps, up to 2,800 members serve with AmeriCorps NCCC each year.



ABOUT DISASTER RELIEF

In addition to the FEMA Corps, the traditional AmeriCorps NCCC teams are coordinated for rapid disaster deployment anywhere in the country. Trained in CPR, first aid, disaster response and firefighting, teams have responded to local and national disasters since the program was established in 1994. Since 2000, members have served more than 5.1 million hours on 1900 disaster services projects across the nation.

WE'RE GETTING THINGS DONE IN MICHIGAN

Holly, MI | YMCA of Metropolitan Detroit

An NCCC team partnered with The YMCA of Metropolitan Detroit to help maintain and renovate camp buildings, land and activities. Members also assisted in the facilitation of Camp Ohiyesa and Camp Nissokone's spring Outdoor Education programs. At camp Nissokone, corps members installed 38 window frames in three cabins, built 19 full sized bed frames, assembled 20 picnic tables, dismantled four old showers, and cleared 1500 pounds of brush. They also completed a full restoration of two 26-foot voyageur canoes. At Camp Ohiyesa corps members helped prepare the campgrounds for visitors by raking leaves and clearing brush, totaling 6600 pounds. The team cleaned a barn, a dining hall, health lodge, and 12 cabins. Corps members also completed a roofing project, which consisted of replacing 30 square feet of shingles on four cabins. The NCCC team also helped facilitate outdoor education as well. Programming included orientation, facilitating outdoor activities, playing games, and performing skits.

Flint, MI | Flint Housing Commission

An NCCC team worked with The Flint Housing Commission (FHC) to prepare public housing units for incoming residents. The FHC seeks to provide its residents with decent, affordable housing in a safe, secure environment helping them to reach their full potential and ultimately become self-sufficient. Members cleaned three 4-bedroom and six 2-bedroom apartments. Once cleaned, holes in the drywall were repaired, the walls and ceilings were painted, and the floor was waxed. Corps members also had the opportunity to assist with the Section 8 housing sign up held during their service with the FHC. During this event, over 2000 community members came to sign up for the wait list, which had been closed for almost ten years.
