ABOUT AMERICORPS NCCC

AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) is a full-time, team-based residential program for men and women ages 18-24. AmeriCorps NCCC members are assigned to one of five regional campuses into teams of approximately ten members, and complete 2- to 3-month projects responding to local communities' needs in every state. Teams serve with local and national organizations, infusing resources and leading volunteers for hundreds of organizations like Habitat for Humanity and the American Red Cross. These young adults lead youth development activities, construct and rehabilitate low-income housing, clean up streams, help communities develop emergency plans, and address other pressing local needs.



ABOUT FEMA CORPS

The AmeriCorps NCCC flexible program structure allows both the opportunity to partner with non-profit or government organizations that might lack the capacity to manage longer grant programs, as well as the ability to create strategic collaborations with other national service programs and federal agencies to magnify the impact on communities served. In 2012, AmeriCorps NCCC collaborated with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and created a new unit of members called FEMA Corps. These teams are devoted solely to FEMA disaster preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery efforts, which strengthen the nation's ability to respond to and recover from disasters while expanding career opportunities for young people. Between the traditional and FEMA Corps, up to 2,800 members serve with AmeriCorps NCCC each year.



ABOUT DISASTER RELIEF

In addition to the FEMA Corps, the traditional AmeriCorps NCCC teams are coordinated for rapid disaster deployment anywhere in the country. Trained in CPR, first aid, disaster response and firefighting, teams have responded to local and national disasters since the program was established in 1994. Since 2000, members have served more than 5.1 million hours on 1900 disaster services projects across the nation.

WE'RE GETTING THINGS DONE IN MISSISSIPPI

Tupelo, MS | NECHAMA

An NCCC team partnered with NECHAMA: Jewish Response for Disaster a voluntary organization that provides natural disaster preparedness, response, and recovery services nationwide to respond to the aftermath of strong storms with multiple tornadoes that hit several locations in Mississippi. Over the course of their deployment, the NCCC team accomplished a great deal while working with NECHAMA. In Itawamba County, MS, the NCCC team assisted homeowners by removing approximately 172,078 pounds of debris from homes affected by the disaster. Additionally, the team worked to demolish 5 structures in addition to gutting 2 homes. Throughout this work, the team coordinated 272 volunteers and engaged 10 NCCC alumni in service. The NCCC team also supported the local chapter of the United Way, offering much-needed volunteer coordination for a blitz clean-up of nearby Tupelo, MS that engaged over 1,000 volunteers in a day of service.

Rolling Fork, MS | City of Rolling Fork

An NCCC team was requested by The City of Rolling Fork to help them in their mission to improve the quality of life for the citizens of Rolling Fork and surrounding area. The team made a lasting impact on the town of Rolling Fork, Mississippi in a very short time. Corps Members helped the city with various community beautification projects including painting the hospital and high school, painting street signage, clearing street curbs, completing landscaping at the local library, and renovating the hospitals' geriatric facilities. The team painted and renovated 3,400 square feet of school rooms or hallways, removed 2,025 lbs. of debris from sidewalks, completed one acre of landscaping, supported one library, renovated two public buildings, renovated one school building, and recruited and trained five community youth leaders.
