ABOUT AMERICORPS NCCC

AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) is a full-time, team-based residential program for men and women ages 18-24. AmeriCorps NCCC members are assigned to one of five regional campuses into teams of approximately ten members, and complete 2- to 3-month projects responding to local communities' needs in every state. Teams serve with local and national organizations, infusing resources and leading volunteers for hundreds of organizations like Habitat for Humanity and the American Red Cross. These young adults lead youth development activities, construct and rehabilitate low-income housing, clean up streams, help communities develop emergency plans, and address other pressing local needs.



ABOUT FEMA CORPS

The AmeriCorps NCCC flexible program structure allows both the opportunity to partner with non-profit or government organizations that might lack the capacity to manage longer grant programs, as well as the ability to create strategic collaborations with other national service programs and federal agencies to magnify the impact on communities served. In 2012, AmeriCorps NCCC collaborated with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and created a new unit of members called FEMA Corps. These teams are devoted solely to FEMA disaster preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery efforts, which strengthen the nation's ability to respond to and recover from disasters while expanding career opportunities for young people. Between the traditional and FEMA Corps, up to 2,800 members serve with AmeriCorps NCCC each year.



ABOUT DISASTER RELIEF

In addition to the FEMA Corps, the traditional AmeriCorps NCCC teams are coordinated for rapid disaster deployment anywhere in the country. Trained in CPR, first aid, disaster response and firefighting, teams have responded to local and national disasters since the program was established in 1994. Since 2000, members have served more than 5.1 million hours on 1900 disaster services projects across the nation.

WE'RE GETTING THINGS DONE IN MONTANA

Roundup, MT | Musselshell Valley Community Foundation

An NCCC team served with Musselshell Valley Community Foundation, where the team focused on flood recovery efforts and spent a majority of their efforts aiding the Roundup Restoration Committee. The team spread new gravel on a playground and painted the interior walls of the local food bank, The Golden Thimble. The team also improved the appearance of three buildings along the main street of town by cleaning and painting their exteriors. Corps members spent time clearing a total of 2,034 pounds of brush from an acre and a half of a vacant lot. The team spent several days at the town's river walk, cleaning up debris that remained from the flood. Additional tasks that corps members completed included picking up debris from three additional vacant lots, planting 17 trees at a war memorial, and cataloging 35 years' worth of artifacts from the local museum. Lastly, The team assisted 4,665 residents of Roundup by cleaning up and restoring areas of town that had been run down either due to previous disasters or lack of maintenance over time.

Virginia City, MT | Montana Heritage Preservation and Development Commission

The Mission of the Montana Heritage Preservation and Development Commission (MHPDC) is to preserve and manage historic resources in Virginia City, Nevada City and Reeder's Alley and promote the appreciation of history through quality visitor experiences. An AmeriCorps NCCC served with the MHPDC, where they preserved historical buildings and provided site maintenance. The renovations corps members completed included work on eighteen buildings, the construction of two roofs, and installation of a temporary floor. The team also relocated several historic Model-T car parts and other artifacts to a more secure facility. Members painted seven buildings and constructed 300 feet of fencing. Corps members landscaped 17 acres and removed 5,500 pounds of debris and trash.
