ABOUT AMERICORPS NCCC

AmeriCorps NCCC (National Civilian Community Corps) is a full-time, team-based residential program for men and women ages 18-24. AmeriCorps NCCC members are assigned to one of five regional campuses into teams of approximately ten members, and complete 2- to 3-month projects responding to local communities' needs in every state. Teams serve with local and national organizations, infusing resources and leading volunteers for hundreds of organizations like Habitat for Humanity and the American Red Cross. These young adults lead youth development activities, construct and rehabilitate low-income housing, clean up streams, help communities develop emergency plans, and address other pressing local needs.



ABOUT FEMA CORPS

The AmeriCorps NCCC flexible program structure allows both the opportunity to partner with non-profit or government organizations that might lack the capacity to manage longer grant programs, as well as the ability to create strategic collaborations with other national service programs and federal agencies to magnify the impact on communities served. In 2012, AmeriCorps NCCC collaborated with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and created a new unit of members called FEMA Corps. These teams are devoted solely to FEMA disaster preparedness, mitigation, response, and recovery efforts, which strengthen the nation's ability to respond to and recover from disasters while expanding career opportunities for young people. Between the traditional and FEMA Corps, up to 2,800 members serve with AmeriCorps NCCC each year.



ABOUT DISASTER RELIEF

In addition to the FEMA Corps, the traditional AmeriCorps NCCC teams are coordinated for rapid disaster deployment anywhere in the country. Trained in CPR, first aid, disaster response and firefighting, teams have responded to local and national disasters since the program was established in 1994. Since 2000, members have served more than 5.1 million hours on 1900 disaster services projects across the nation.

Manchester, NH | New Hampshire Food Bank

New Hampshire Food Bank and an NCCC team partnered together to support the Food Bank's Production Garden. The mission of the New Hampshire Food Bank is to feed hungry people by soliciting and effectively distributing grocery products, perishable foods and services through a statewide network of approved agencies; by advocating for systemic change; and by educating the public about the nature of and solutions to hunger in New Hampshire. Corps members practiced organic methods to harvest produce, remove weeds and pests, clear and turn raised beds, and prepare the garden for winter. Along with garden and plant care, the team was also responsible for managing youth, corporate, and church groups that volunteer at the garden. The work the members accomplished will allow the NH Food Bank to yield more high quality food for New Hampshire families and help to sustain a volunteer program that will draw in and keep community members involved in producing healthy foods.

Kingston, NH | YMCA Camp Lincoln

NCCC members partnered with the Southern District YMCA to serve as facilitators and counselors to work with children aged 3-15 years in a summer camp setting. The mission of the Southern District YMCA, for 88 years, is to put Christian principles into practice through programs that build healthy mind, body and spirit for all. The members modeled the character traits of caring, respect, honesty and responsibility in all of their actions and dialogs with fellow staffers and campers. Additionally, the members assisted with maintenance and facility and outdoor projects, such as widening on-site trails, repairing and replacing split-rail fences, clearing brush, and painting cabins.
