| Baltimore, MD | Baltimore, MD Harvard Kennedy School Social Impact Bond Lab | Baltimore is exploring the use of SIBs to improve social service delivery. Possible project policy areas include health and public safety. Once policy areas and possible projects are selected, the SIB Lab will use available data and evidence to conduct a feasibility analysis of the proposed projects using the PFS model. The feasibility analysis would focus on supporting development five main aspects of the PFS transaction: (1) assessing whether the proposed interventions produce the desired outcomes; (2) confirming that the likely outcomes satisfy cost-benefit principles; (3) developing an efficient and effective payment structure within a PFS model; (4) insuring that there are adequate service providers that can deliver the desired outcomes; and (5) establishing rigorous evaluation criteria and metrics to measure the initiative's outcomes. |
