Milwaukee, WI	Community Advocates, Inc. National Council on Crime and Delinquency	Community Advocates will pilot Youth Works MKE (YWM), a 12-month program that provides subsidized employment, academic support, mentoring and Social Emotional Learning to young men of color enrolled in high school and at risk of criminal system involvement. The program is based on One Summer Plus Chicago, an enhanced employment program that included part-time summer employment, mentoring and cognitive behavioral therapy. YWM will expand on the Chicago, One Summer Plus model by extending employment and support to youth throughout the school year. During the summer months, participants will work 16 hours per week and participant in all mentoring and social emotional learning activities. During the school year, youth continue part time employment up to ten hours a week. Mentoring and Social Emotional Learning activities are decreased and tailored for youth individually. Youth that face academic challenges have an emphasis on academic support that is provide in coordination with school based services.
Milwaukee, WI	Hunger Task Force Share Our Strength	Hunger Task Force, locally founded, locally funded, and locally run since 1974, is an anti-hunger public policy organization and food bank in Milwaukee.
